AIR CANADA STARTS FLIGHTS TO MIAMI JUNE 1
Montreal - Air Canada has announced that, subject
to government approval, it will inaugurate service
b etween Canada and Miami on June 1.

The new daily return flights will operate between Montreal, Toronto, Tampa and Miami and will feature the airline's new DC-9 Twin Jet.

The Canadian carrier was awarded the new route following bilateral agreement between the Canadian and United States governments.
