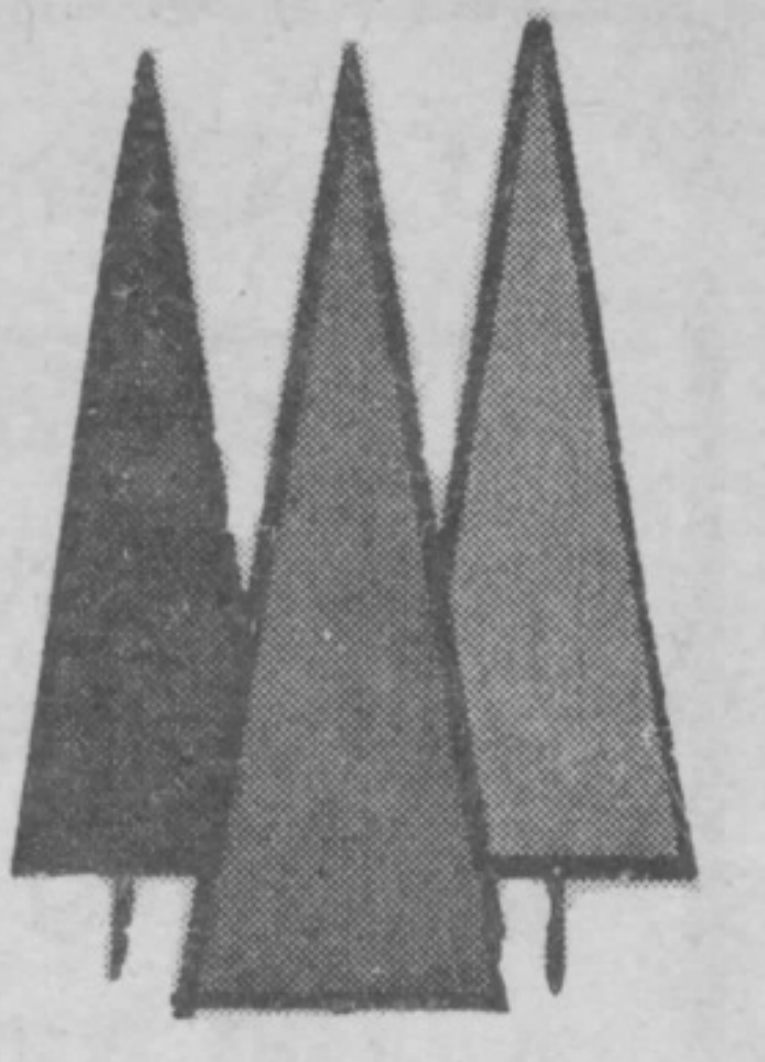

While the dainty frocks of the little girls and manly suits of the boys certainly added to the program, the really outstanding quality was that every child could sing and possessed natural rhythm, a factor not common to such young children.

The program consisted of action songs as follows:- Welcome Song, Jesus Loves, There are Three Little Magic Words, The Little Turtle, Robin in The Rain, Here is a Bunny, The Little White Duck (with finger puppetry), Ten Little Indians, Jack In the Box, If you're Happy and You Know It, Swimming Pool and a rhythm band number.

Many parents went on from the concert to the public school to register their children for September first grade classes.
