PLAYGROUND LEADERS TRAINING COURSE

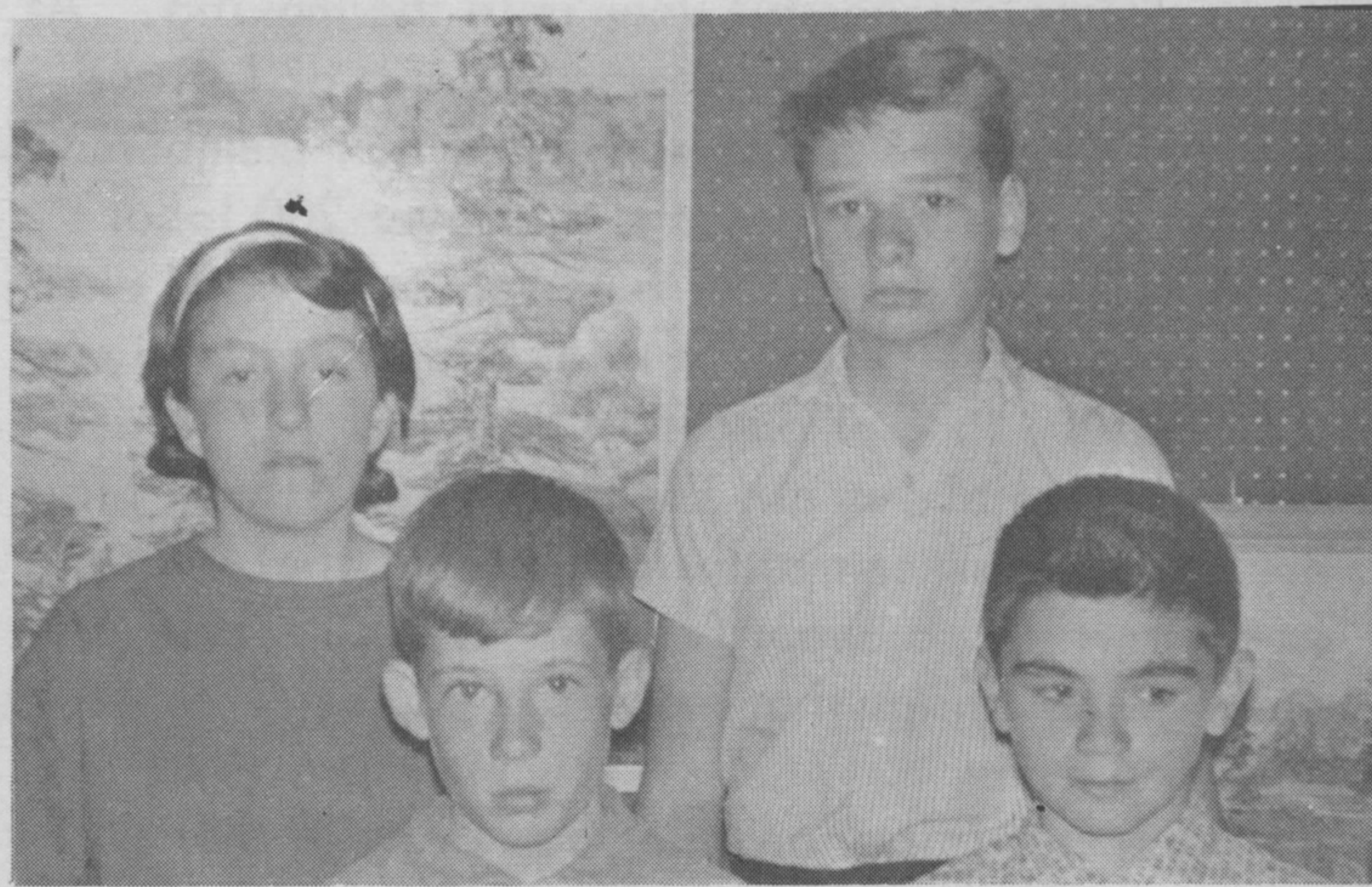

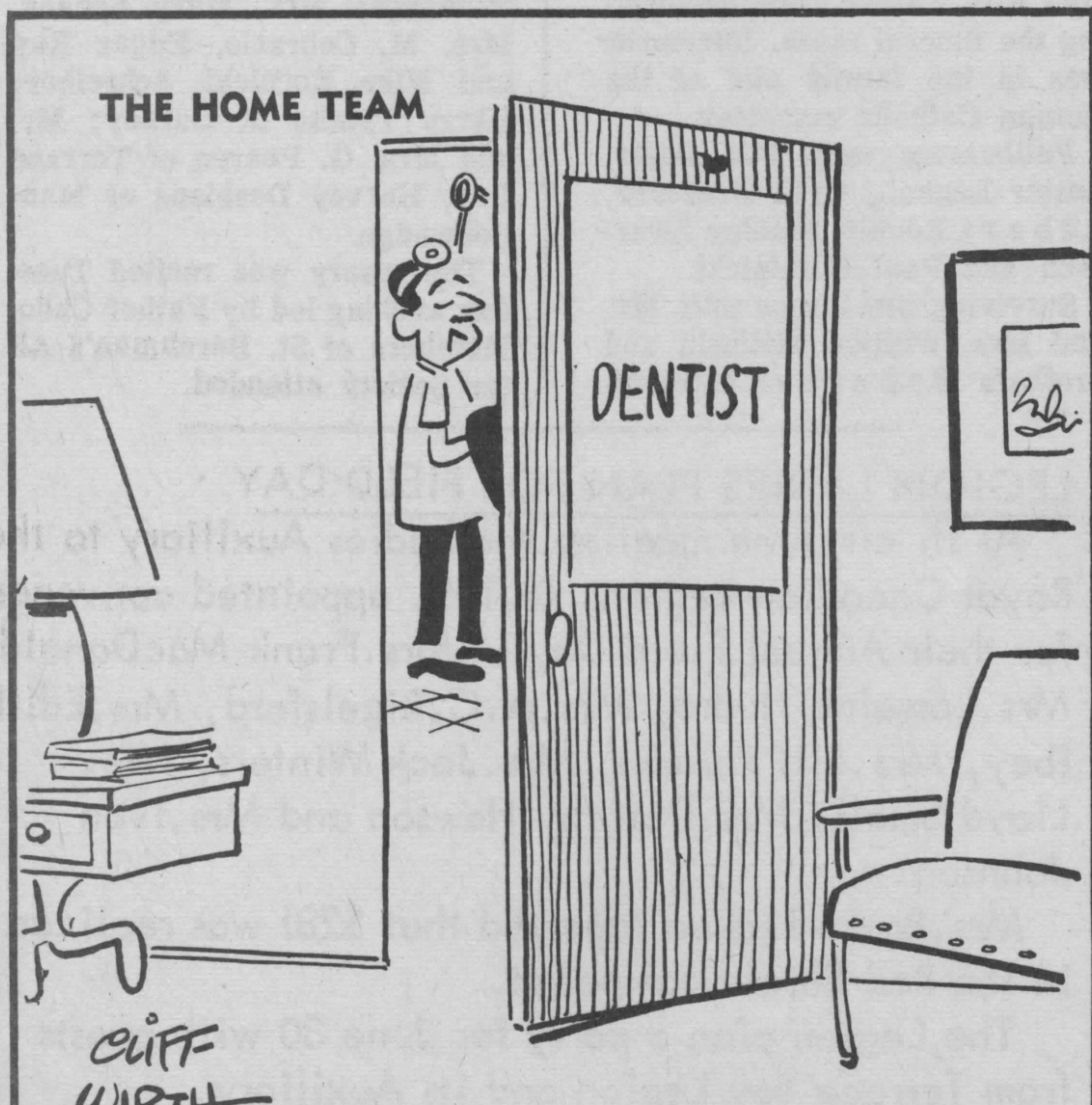
Junior Bowlers winning team - Back, Joanne Stevens, Lorne Pinkerton - front, Ricky Hamilton, Dan Edmunds.
