entrance will permit the staging of local performances.

The tractor-trailers are unique in Canada with respect to design and capacity. They're the largest vehicles to travel on North American roads. Each trailer is 50 feet long, 10 feet broad and 12 1/2 feet high and is hauled by a 23-foot truck. In length alone, this makes each vehicle about the length of a city bus and six times the length of a compact car.

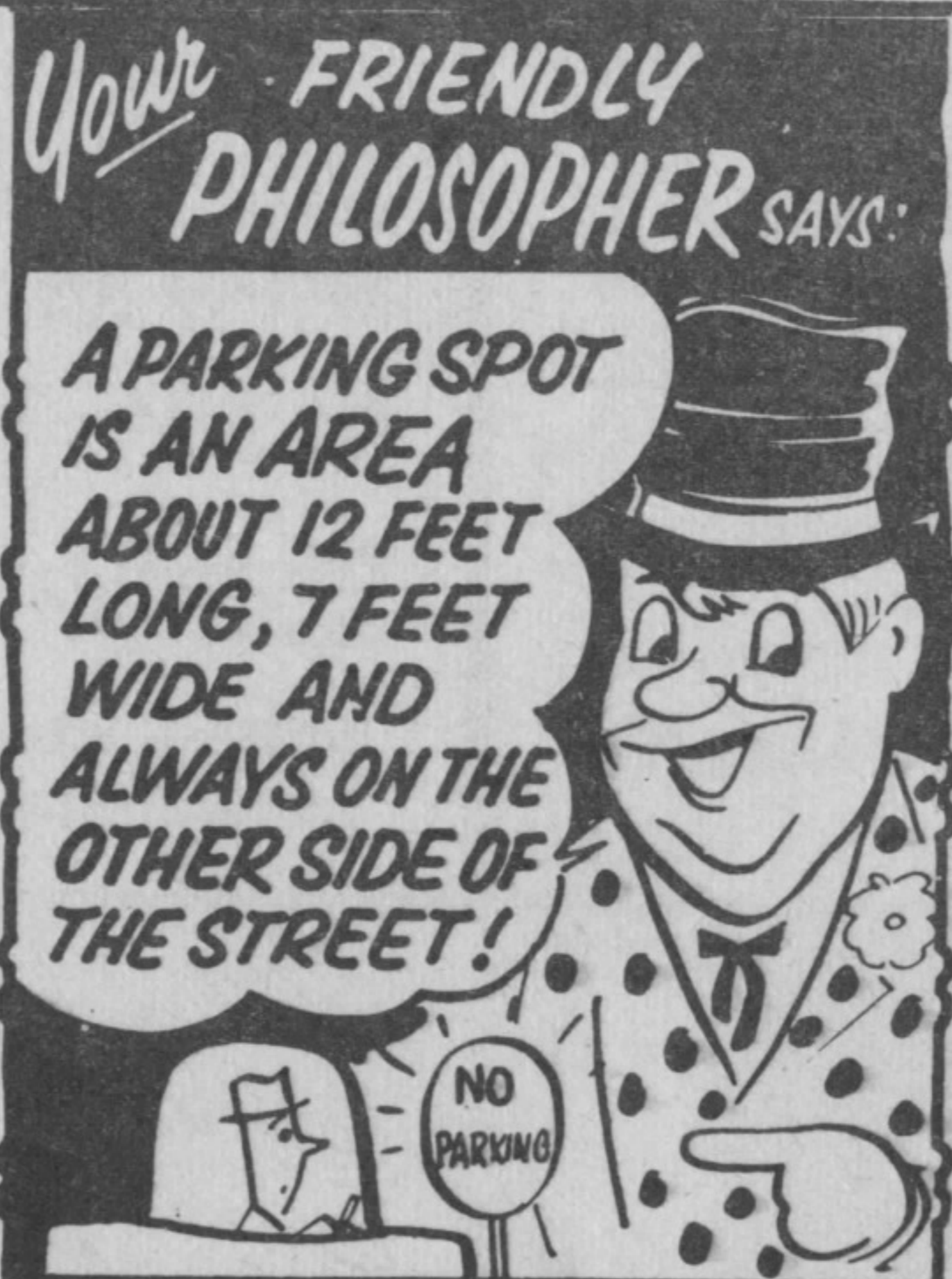
