

HYDRO AREA OFFICE ADOPTS D.S.T.

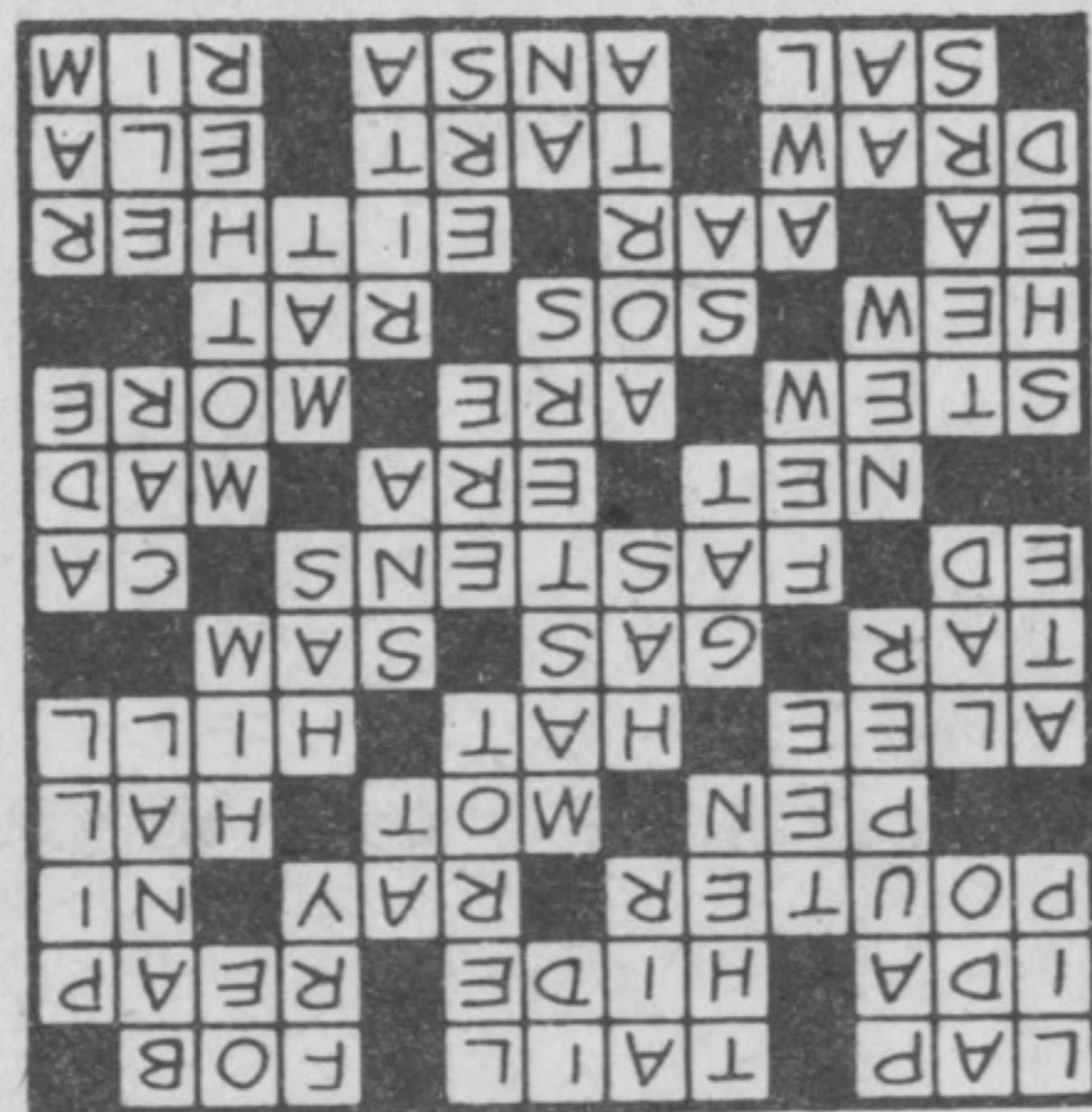
To be consistent with the municipality in which the area office is located, working hours of Ontario Hydro's area office in Terrace Bay have been changed from Eastern Standard to Eastern Daylight Saving.

G.L.Crandlemire, Area Manager, in announcing the change, pointed out that the municipality of Terrace Bay has adopted Eastern Daylight Saving Time for a period from July 1st to September 5th, inclusive. Since most of the area staff are located in Terrace Bay, the change to Daylight Time will be consistent with that in the town. Office hours will remain the same as before - 8.30 A.M. to 12.00 noon and 1.00 P.M. to 4.30 P.M.

When the town returns to Eastern Standard time in the fall, the office will also revert to Standard Time.

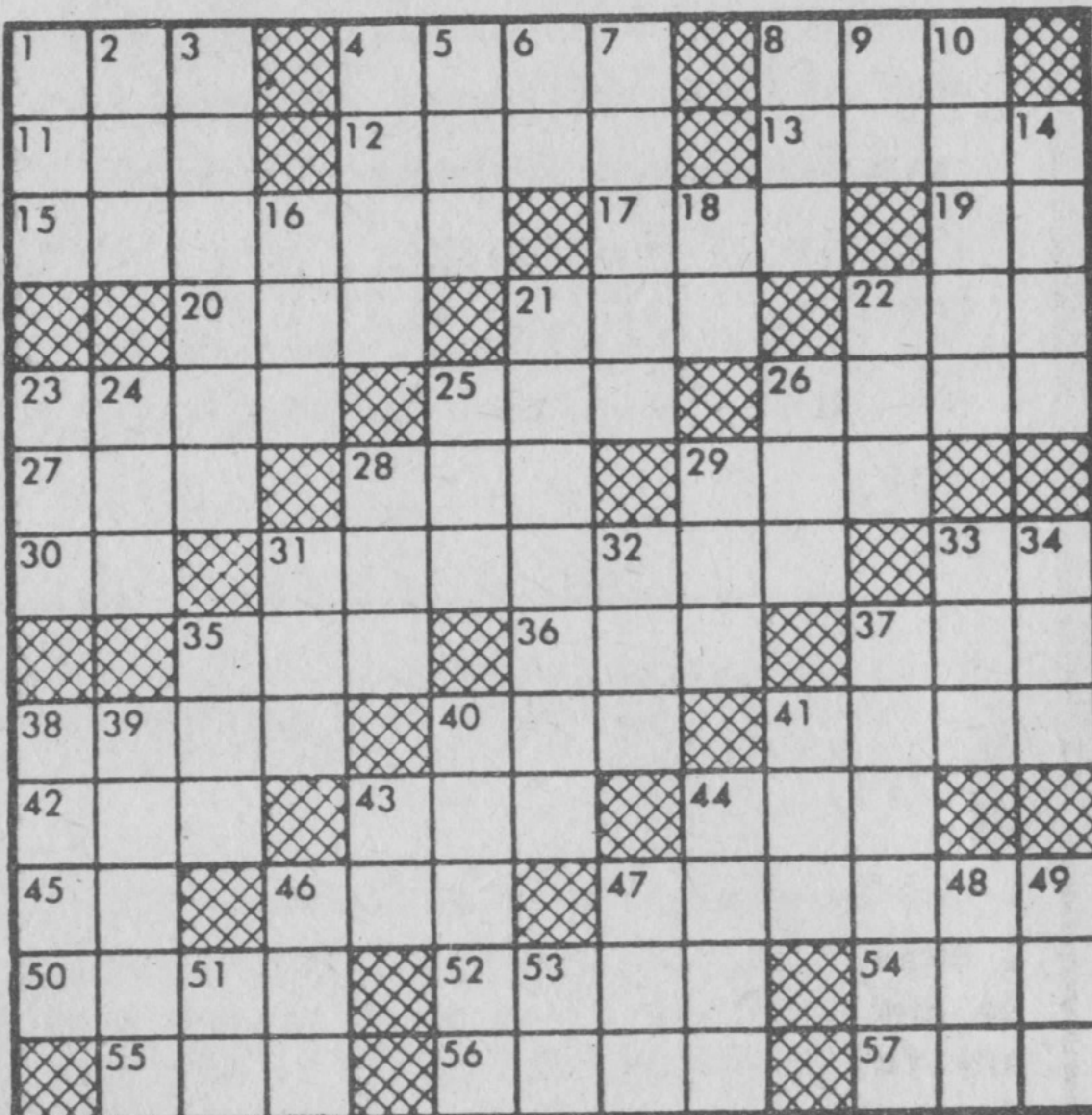

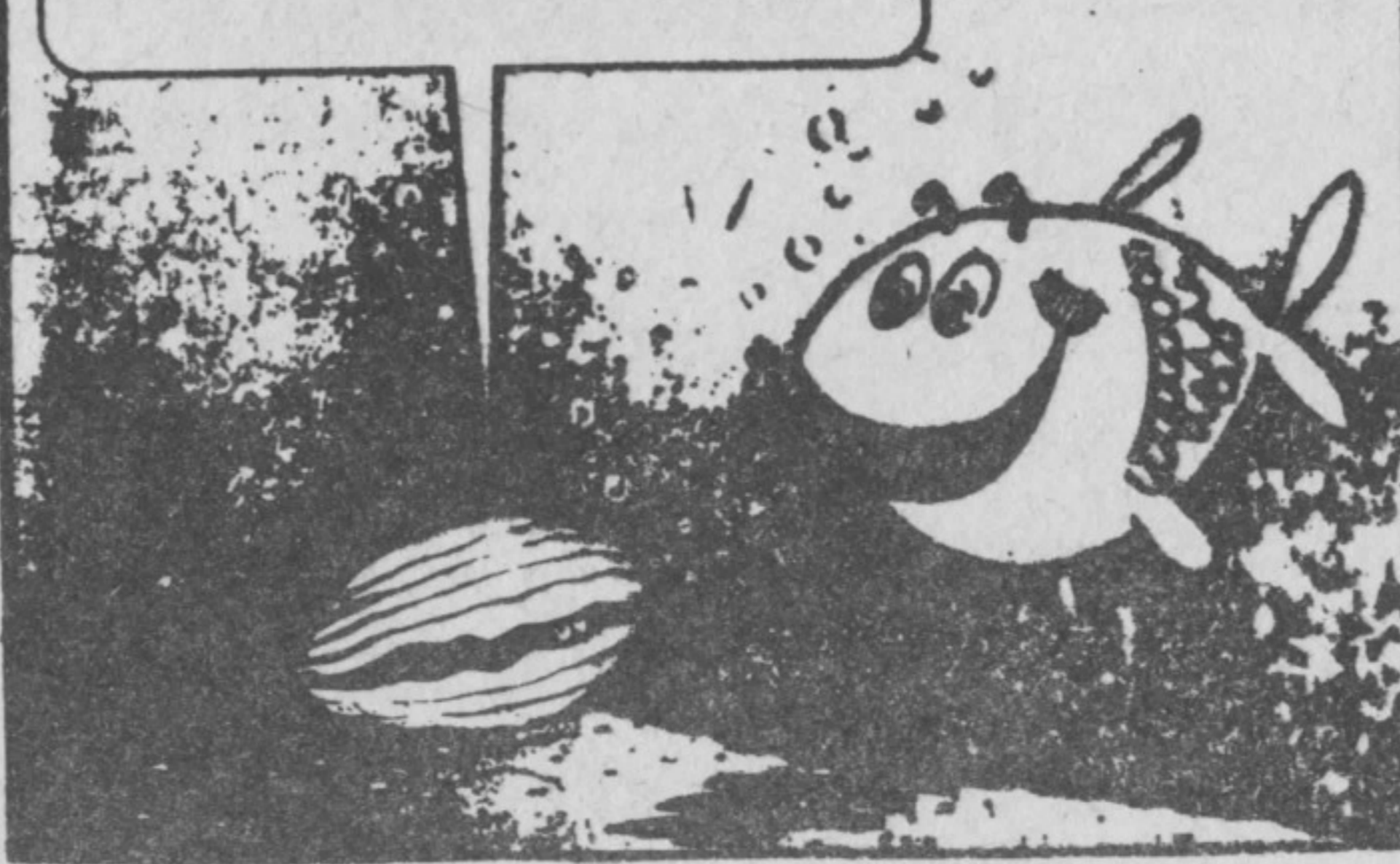

NEW PRIZE CATEGORY FOR ROSSPORT DERBY

To help the Fisheries Research Board of Canada determine the total catch of Lake Trout by anglers in the Nipigon Bay area, the Rosspport Derby is offering a special prize each week. As they are reported, each fish will be numbered and at the end of the week the angler whose trout matches a sealed lucky number will be eligible for a prize.

For example, suppose the sealed lucky number for the week was 13 - the angler bringing in the 13th fish for that week receives the prize. The next week it might be the 4th or the 10th or the 40th--so bring them all in - large or small.
