When you see a school bus with red lights flashing --STOP. Whether you are approaching the bus from the front or overtaking it from the rear, the flashing red lights mean you must stop. You must stay stopped as long as the red lights are flashing.

This law applies to all motorists except those approaching from the front on a highway with separate roadways.

Drivers who fail to stop are liable to fines of up to \$50 for the first offence, \$100 for a second offence and \$200 for a third offence. There is also a penalty of four demerit points for each offence.
