

21 YRS OLD?

When you turn 21 you're no longer covered by your parents' Hospital Insurance. To keep insured, you must take out individual membership within 30 days. Get your application form at a bank, a hospital, or from the Commission.

NEWLY WED?

The 'family' Hospital Insurance premium must now be paid to cover husband and wife. Notify your 'group' without delay OR, if you both pay premiums direct, notify the Commission.

NEW JOB?

To keep insured follow the instructions on the Hospital Insurance Certificate of Payment Form 104' that your present employer is required to give you on leaving.

SCHREIBER COUNCIL SETS WATER INSTALLATION PLAN

A five year plan for water installations on Bayview and Hillview streets was adopted at the September council meeting. This gives a division of 60% to residents and 40% to municipality fund and does not include any previously paid. A two-way plan for payment was offered, cash or five year payment, with interest added.

Consequent to a request from R.J. Stortini, adequate lighting will be installed on Bayview Street.

Approval of a district assessor was held over. It is agreed that a town re-assessment is needed but if it is done by the town assessor (the Town Clerk), extra office help will be needed during his absence.

Concern was expressed at the delapidated condition of the YMCA building which represents a real fire hazard. Councillor Spadoni said he was told of tenders for its demolition and felt this would soon be carried out.

D. Beno Agency was awarded fire insurance coverage for the Fire Hall with premium of \$4.40. Bruce Simon is to be contacted for additional coverage on the Arena, the present insurance considered far below what it should be.

A By-Law to establish a group life and medical insurance plan for town employees was passed. MLA, G. Wardrop wrote stating he was assured a Centennial grant to assist in the community rink and centre renovations

is underway.

Council approved and concurred with preparation of a design report for provincially owned sewage works, a portion of which is part of the townships sewage works program.

Council endorsed a resolution that the Municipality of Paipoonge be authorized to draft any issues to cover expenditures of said township of Schreiber re erection and establishment of proposed district of Thunder Bay homes for the aged.

The Lions Club were given permission to hold a tag day on October 15. Council held over a request from the Salvation Army for a donation. Since almost all associations in this field carry out door to door collections yearly, Council feel that donations from them represent a double payment from rate-payers and are reluctant to discriminate in favour of one organization.

Council, disturbed over increasing accidents on the highway, feel that better ambulance coverage must be provided and will send a proposal to Mayor Saul Laskin of Port Arthur: that Port Arthur covers from that city to the vicinity of Ouimet; Nipigon to Gravel; Schreiber from Gravel to Terrace Bay; Terrace Bay to some point west of Marathon and Marathon from there to a given point east of their town; in each case trying to work the area covered by regular OPP patrols.

In reply to Council's request that quarters for staff for proposed flying base on Hayes Lake be erected in Schreiber, the Dept. of Lands & Forests stated the plan being considered is just for summer staff and they would be required to remain at the base to protect equipment and supplies. If a permanent staff is considered Schreiber's proposal will be given further thought.

General accounts of \$15,141.31 and water accounts of \$3,799.24 were passed for payment.

The resolution of the town of Thorold, as amended and endorsed by the Mayor's and Reeves' Assoc. for presentation to the Ontario Government was heartily endorsed by Schreiber. The resolution follows:-
WHEREAS, education costs are consuming a steadily increasing share of municipal taxes and,
WHEREAS, the minister has publicly stated that the province has a responsibility to provide young people with an education and,
WHEREAS, municipal taxes have now reached the saturation point and needed municipal services are often postponed or neglected and, (Cont'd P.15)
