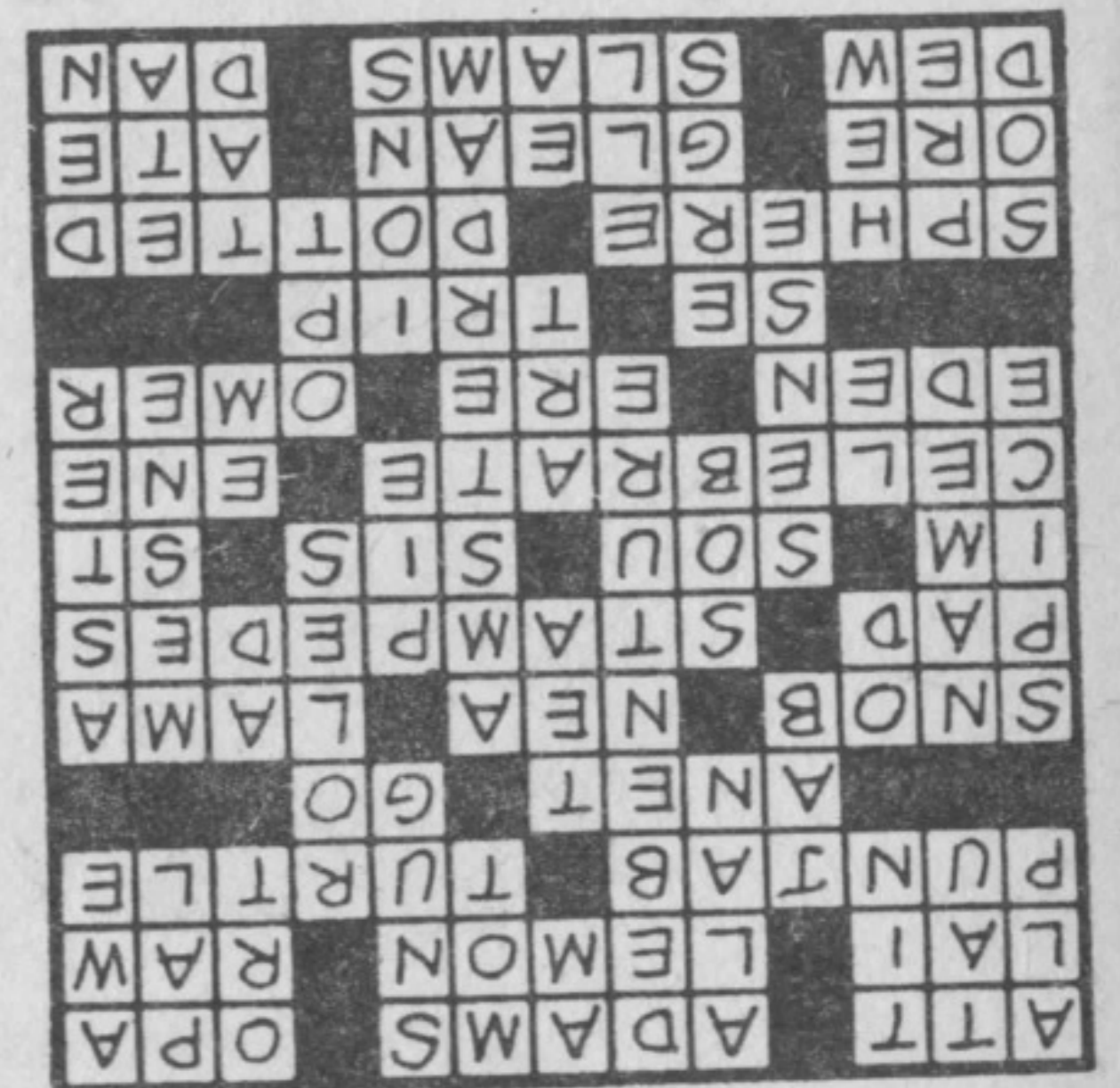

The technical staff-designer, stage manager, lighting man, etc. Blocking the play - this step will be taken in discussion and demonstration of various aspects of staging-grouping, focus, balance, etc. Rehearsals - the main part of the program will see the rehearsal of the chosen play with improvisation and exercises in movement, voice work and general relaxation. There will be ample time for demonstration of handling stage business, stage properties, movement and characterization. Final rehearsal - incorporation of costumes, properties and the set. Technical rehearsals with sound and lighting. Performance and critical assessment of performance.

Miss Gaylor has considerable experience and ability in this field, having been production manager

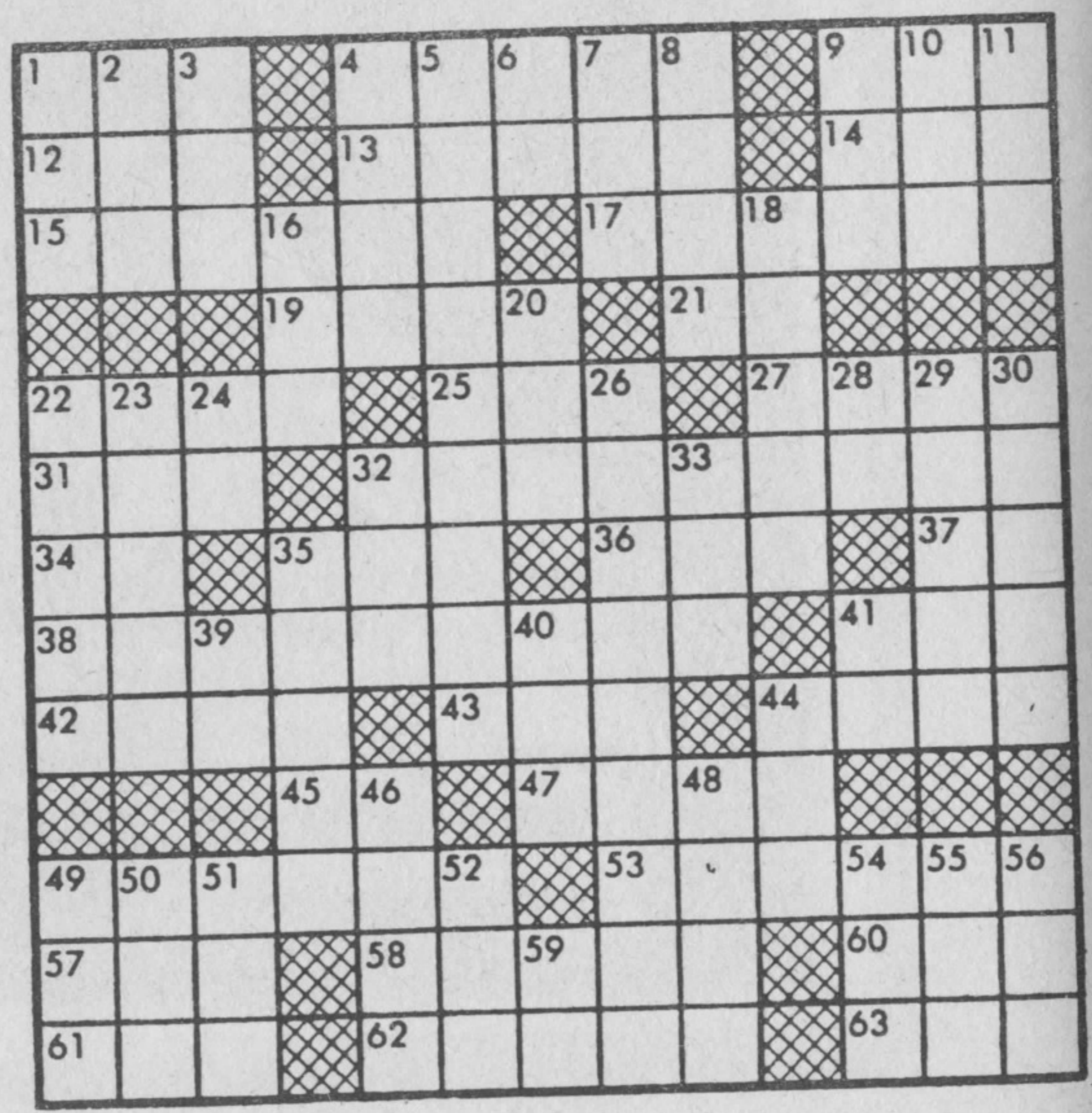
