ROSSPORT RESIDENTS AGAINST FORESTRY BASE MOVE TO TERRACE BAY

The executive of the Thunder Bay Riding Association of the Progressive Conservative party of Ontario met at the Rossport Inn last Thursday evening for a Lake Superior Trout dinner and to hear guest speaker, The Hon.Kelso Roberts, Minister of Lands and Forests. Accompanying Mr.Roberts were L.Ringham, regional director of Port Arthur, N.B.McMahan of Toronto and C.Acheson, Asst. Deputy Minister, of Toronto.

TOWN DUMP TO BE MOVED

The refuse area for the Township, commonly referred to as the Town Dump, will cease to exist in its present location as of October 3rd. The reason for moving the dump is to prevent possible contamination from this area into Lake Superior.

The new Town refuse area will be located east of the Mill. It will be approached from off the mill road, opposite the road that leads to the Moose Hall (South Camp).

There will be no burning at the new dump. As the refuse is collected and emptied, it will be buried in trenches in the ground. Signs will be posted showing new location.
