6. Tuesday and Thursday evenings, Nov.8, and 10 will be set aside for practice games and instruction to new curlers for both the evening and afternoon leagues.

Tuesday, November 15th.

8. Membership fees will remain at \$14 with all fees being paid prior to the first scheduled league game. Everyone is reminded that they must be members of the Recreation Association.

9. Norma Crockford was elected Club Delegate to the Northwestern Ontario Ladies Curling Association.


