KNOW YOUR EGGS SAVE ON GROCERY BILLS

Here's a tip that could cut down your weekly grocery bill. In the next few weeks, millions of young pullets will start laying eggs. Initially, they produce medium-sized eggs that sell for less than Grade A large. Housewives with an eye to a bargain should use the following formula in determining whether the medium eggs are the ones to buy, suggests Colin McLaren, associate editor of Canadian Hotel and Restaurant. Example: Assume the price of Grade A large is 72 cents per dozen. Divide this figure by eight and deduct the answer from the price shown. Thus eight into 72 goes nine; nine from 72 is 63. Then, if the price of medium eggs is less than 63 cents, housewives should buy medium.
