latest scholarship in scriptural studies, this pamphlet, entitled "I Discover the Bible," is addressed to adults on a popular level.

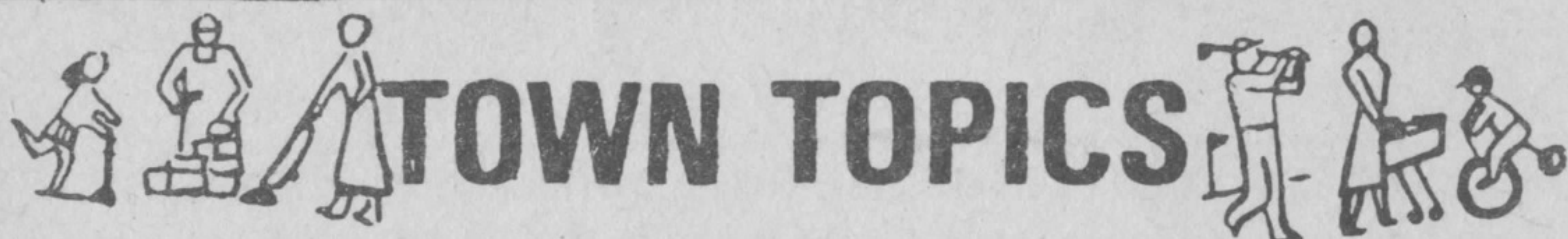
