Another recommendation that Terrace Bay join the District Health Unit was included in Dr.M.McCausland's health report for 1966. Council accepted the report with a proviso that

the recommendation re joining the Health Unit be investigated and a report on their decision given to Dr. McCausland.

Minutes of the last meeting were adopted and current correspondence read and discussed. An invitation to join Noda was rejected. A request to establish a Drive-In Restaurant will be dealt with after lessee of the property submits plans and the approval of the property owner. A communication listed library board members as H.Ratchford, Mrs. S. Angus, J. Brooks and Mrs. T. Dorland. Councillors J.Caccamo, D.Desrosier also Mrs. O.Chapman, H.Ratchford and F.Anderson were appointed members of the Recreation Committee bringing this group to a total of eight. A motion to amend the Recreation By-Law covering this change in number from 7 to 8 members, was passed. Council authorized purchase of advertising in the current High School Year Book and requested that Past Reeves J. Heenan and W. Adamo have their portraits taken for hanging in Council chambers. The Department of Labour were advised that two men are being trained to operate the refrigeration plant at the Recreation Centre. After discussing a letter regarding parking at St. Martin's School, members agreed that teachers should park on Laurier Avenue. Membership in the Ontario Municipal League was approved.
