# AMATEUR SKI COACHES CLINIC HELD

A popular feature this past weekend at the Terrace Bay Ski Club was the Amateur Ski Coaches Clinic given under the direction of Terry Axelson of the Lakehead. Mr. Axelson is a member of the Canadian Ski Instructors Alliance.

From Saturday morning until late Sunday afternoon he had his classes out on the slopes interspersed with discussion/rest periods in the hut. Attendance was pleasing and should do much to increase the facilities offered by the club.

This season the club has instituted two innovations

which will help to increase the safety feature of the sport. A qualified "first aider" will be in the hut all the time it is open, ready and equipped for any emergency. In addition a Ski Patrol has been recruited and trained having complete authority on the slopes and full backing of the Club executive to enforce both club rules and government regulations.

The efficiency of this service was demonstrated Saturday afternoon when the first casualty occurred. Nine year old Michael Caccamo fell and within seconds members of the Ski Patrol had reached him, and within five minutes Michael was in a station wagon on his way to the hospital which had been told of his arrival by telephone which is an additional service installed.

Fortun ately Michael suffered only strained muscles but the efficient system has been tested and proved a credit which is due to those present.
