

ANNUAL MEETING HELD OF K-C E.C.F.

The Annual Meeting of the members of the Kimberly Clark Employees' Charity Fund was held in the Recreation Centre at 7 p.m. on January 31st.

Chairman, W. Baillie, in his annual report, stated that \$6,167.50 was collected and distributed during 1966, an increase of about \$160. over 1965. He reported a total membership of 445 representing approximately 83% of the Kimberly-Clark payroll.

The Chairman moved a vote of thanks to Joseph Marcella, one of the original Directors, who has retired from Kimberly-Clark. J. Steen and J. Papousek were elected to the Board of Directors.

It was suggested by those present that all members of KC-ECF should review their donations with a view to increasing them to help compensate for higher costs and increasing need. CARE of Canada and its special project, The Vietnam Relief Fund, were cited as examples of organizations that could use more help from KC-ECF. Kimberly-Clark employees may join KC-ECF or increase their donations by phoning the Employment Office or contacting any of the Directors.

For 1967, W. Baillie continues as Chairman, G. Ramsay as Vice-Chairman, and J. MacDonald as Secretary-Treasurer. Directors are Mrs. C. Buck, R. Harris, V. Hopper, H. Hamilton, J. Steen and J. Papousek.
