

SKI-DOOS TO THE NORTH POLE!

Led by Ralph Plaisted, a St. Paul insurance man in private life, a mixed U.S.--Canadian team will make an attempt to reach 90° true North -- The Pole. The eight man team will use Bombardier Ski-Doo's.

A press audience heard David O'Brien, a Canadian Dept. of Northern Affairs officer and Arctic expert, say that the Ski-Doo was the only snowmobile tough enough to make such a demanding journey. Said O'Brien: "Those of us in Northern Affairs won't look to any other snowmobile. Experience has taught us that the Bombardier product is as good in the North as the Eskimos are themselves."

The Arctic expeditionary force will assemble in Montreal March 18, flying from there to Eureka, a remote weather station on Wellesmere Island. A week later they will move northwestward along Nansen Sound. Their journey over the ice will be about 800 miles. It is believed that the journey can be made in three weeks.

Bombardier Snowmobile Limited is supplying the Polar party with 10 Ski-Doo's. The machines will be lined with styrofoam so that--in the event they break through bad ice--they will float.

The Columbia Broadcasting System has assigned a photographer to the expedition. This major network plans to do an hour-long documentary on the trip for nation-wide TV transmission.

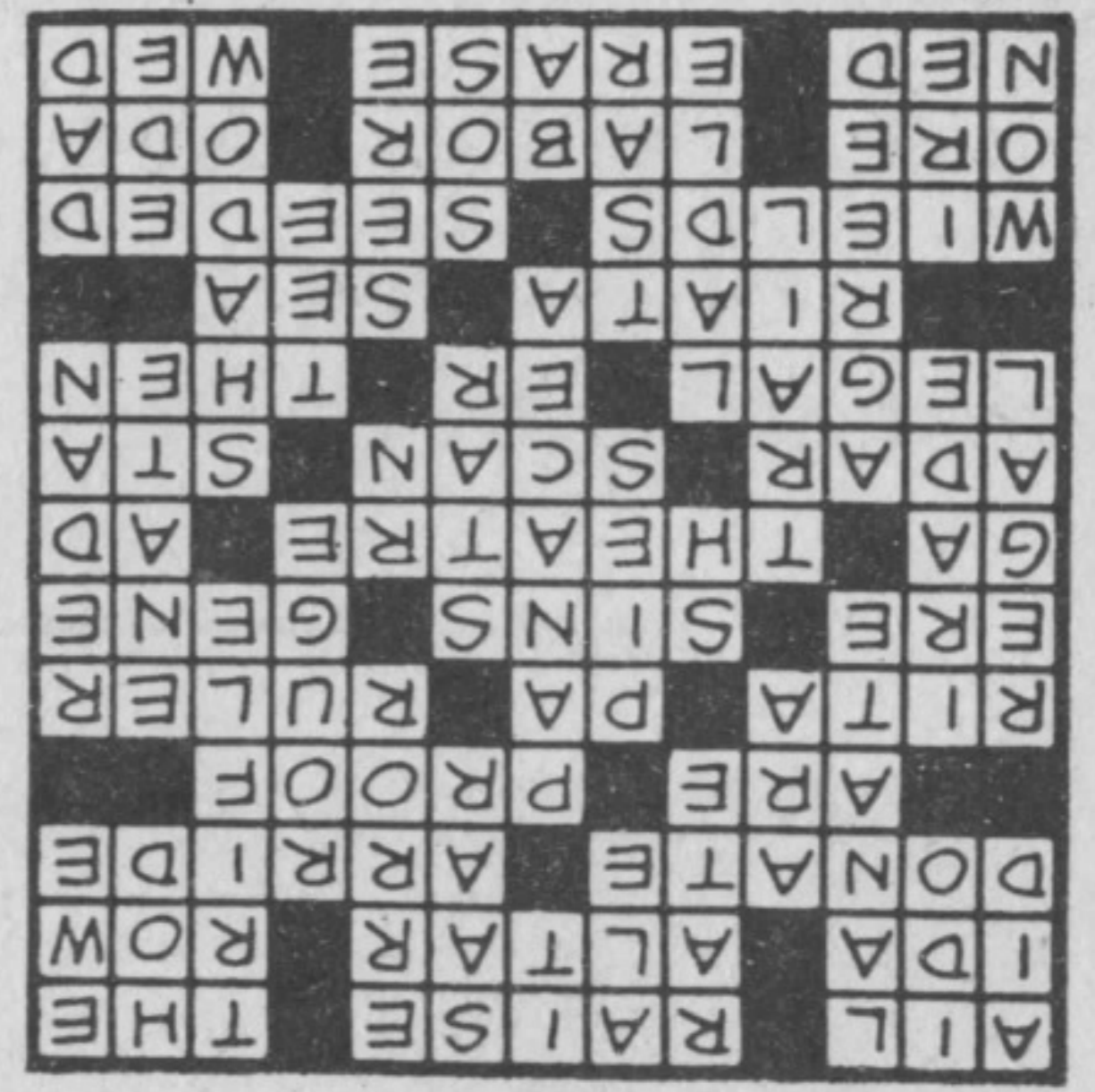
TICKETS AVAILABLE FOR N.H.L. OLDTIMER GAME
