

**MR. FRANK ROEN  
BURIED AT SCHREIBER**

The funeral of the late Francis Valentine (Frank) Roen, whose death at the age of 52, occurred on February 18 following a long illness, was conducted in St. Andrew's United Church on February 22 by Rev. C.E. Prinselaar.
