Re: By-Law 129B - Licensing & Regulating Dogs.


By-Law No. 129B of The Township of Terrace Bay reads in part, as follows:

"The owner, possessor or harbourer of every dog, shall on or before the 1st. day of March of each year, cause the same to be registered, numbered, licensed, and described, in the Municipal office".

"No person shall permit his dog to run at large in the Township except when on a chain or lead and under the immediate charge and control of some competent person".

Dog owners who have not purchased their dog tags by March 15; 1967, will be issued a summons through the local Police Department based on the 1966 annual census report.
