A delegation from the proposed Community Services Committee were invited to attend the next council meeting. The Grade 8 class of St. Martin's School were given permission to sell chocolate bars to help them raise funds to attend Expo.

Ontario Hydro wrote quoting prices on school book covers. The matter was referred to the schools.

The Department of Highways wrote regarding street lighting in the Park area estimated at a cost of \$3000. Councillor Desrosier was appointed as representative at Chamber of Commerce meetings.

Councillor Sinotte submitted proposed prices to re-

finish the bowling alleys during the summer and displayed wording and dimensions of the plaque to be installed in Centennial Park.

Councillor Bray started a short, sharp discussion on school administration when he questioned individual ordering of stationery. He felt a saving could be affected by pooling orders and asking for tenders on school supplies.

While the school budgets have not yet been disclosed, Councillor Caccamo indicated his concern with rising educational costs by agreeing that any means of saving money should be explored.

Collection of garbage in the shopping area was discussed and authorities at the Mill will be contacted.
