With the help of a large architectural photograph and brochures, he explained the magnitude of the present building program and the campaign for public support which will embrace not only the Lakehead cities, but all North-western Ontario communities.

Mr. H. Sharp, President of the Carpenters Union in the Lakehead, then spoke on the support being given to this program by Labour Unions.

Following the speakers, a question and answer period was held.
