MILL RATES SET

Schreiber Town Council held a special meeting on April 12 to accept the 1967 assessment roll of \$1,952,986 and to study school estimates and consider the 1967 budget. The levy is as follows:- Mill Rates - Residential 45.41 - General, Commercial 48.92. Public School residential 19.11 - commercial 21.23. Separate School, residential 22.61 - commercial 25.12. High School, residential 35.53 and commercial 39.47.

Estimates for year's spending - General, 93,010. Schools - 113,063. Tenders for vehicle insurance were opened and one from Beno Agency accepted.
