Mrs. Gary Drake is in McKellar hospital and Mrs. George Walsh is in St. Joseph's hospital, Port Arthur.

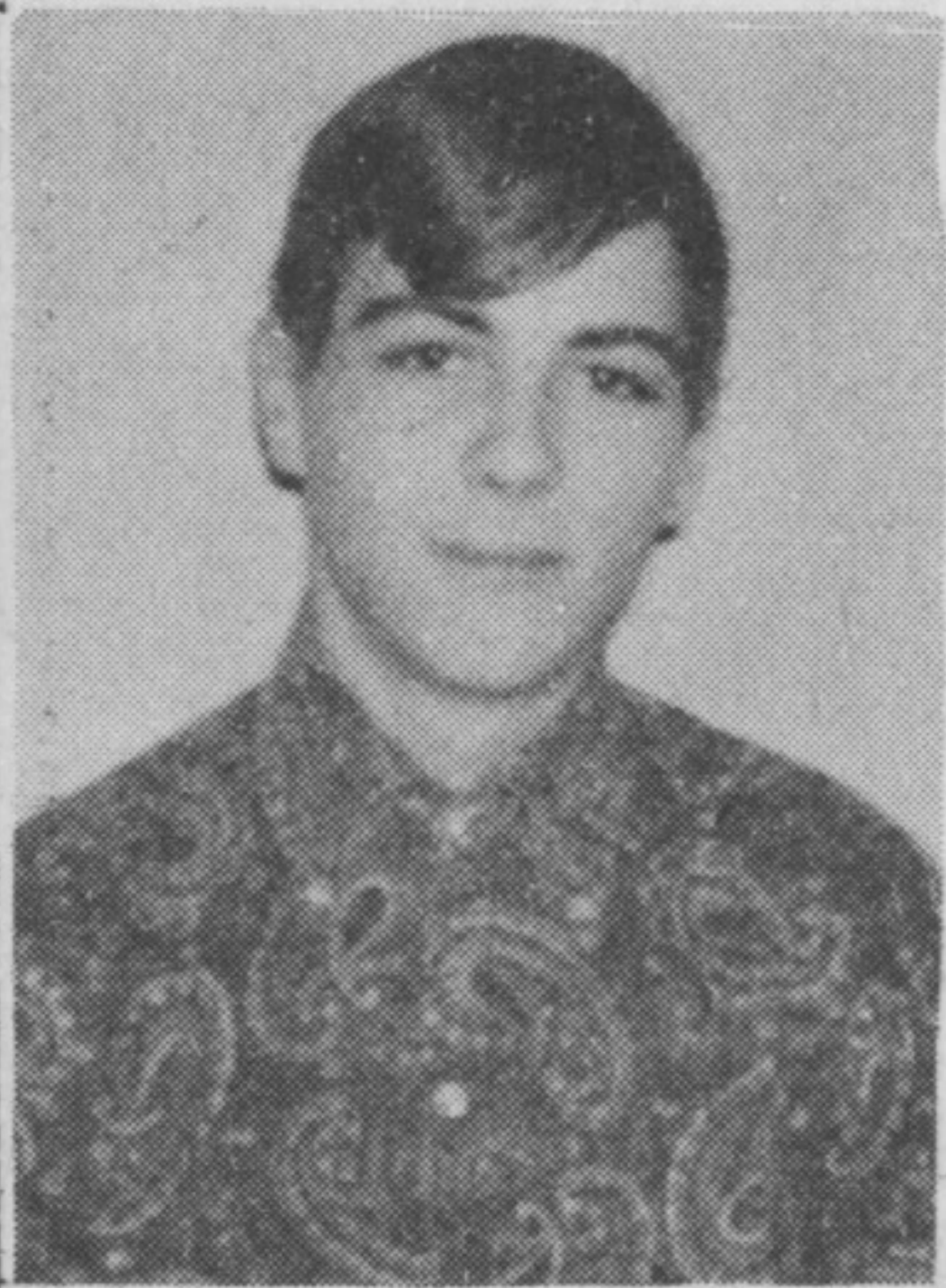
George Duncan is in Sault Ste. Marie visiting Mr. and Mrs. Leo Aber.
