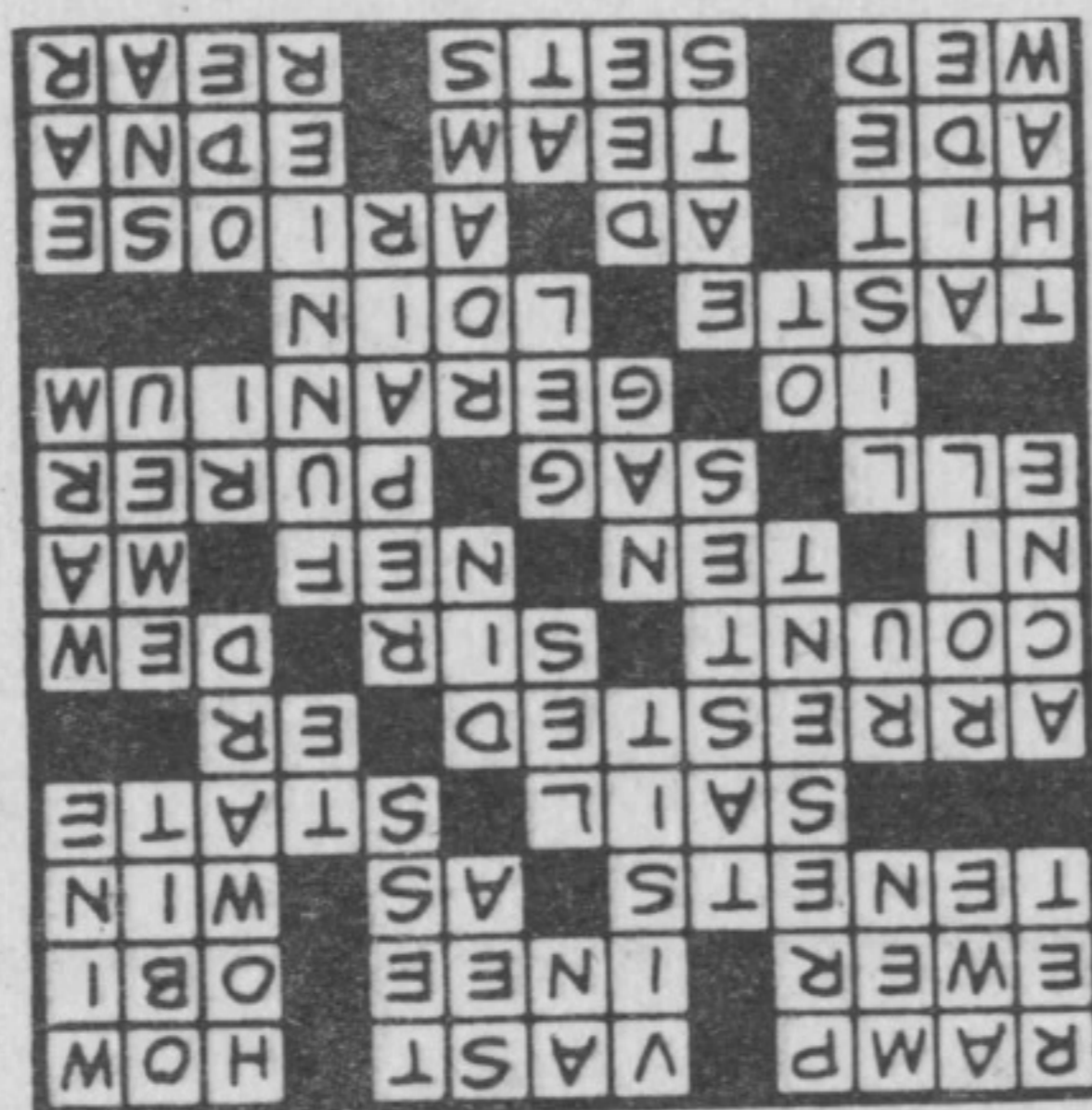

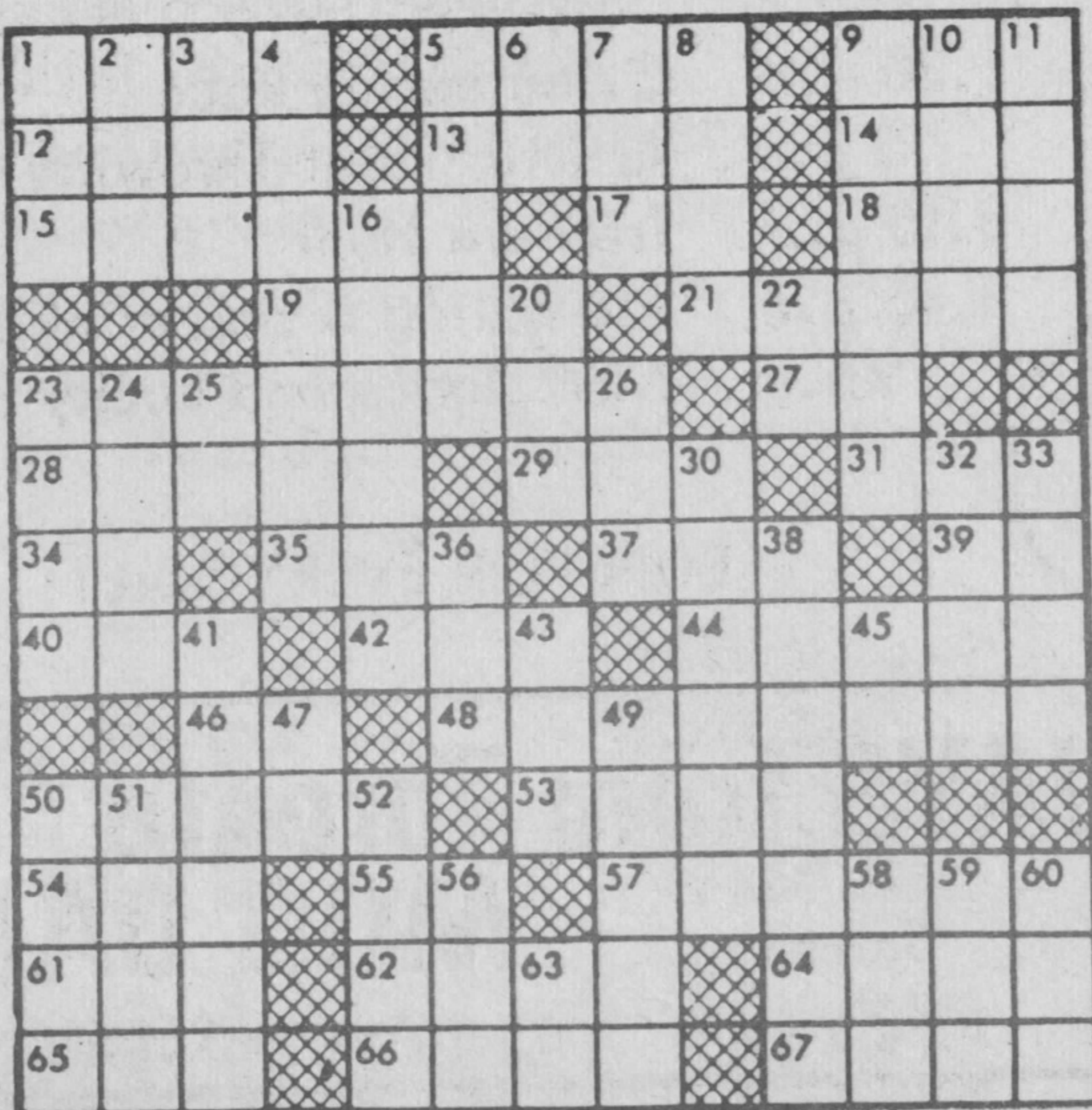

SUIT YOUR TYPE. Strictly feminine? Sew a "Dandy" pantsuit with a froth of frosty eye-lett at neck and cuffs. Pick cool raspberry sherbet pin-striped with creamy vanilla and stretch the jacket long and smooth for maximum elegance. A bit of a tomboy? You'll love the English-style pantsuit with two pairs of pants -- one short and one long and lean. Spare shoulders, narrow lapels and high three-button closing mark the skinny look of the jacket. Tailor it in the sharp, clean look of linen . . . cocoa and cream lined up in a neat tater-sall check. Top with a mod cap to match.

FOR PANTS PERFECT, purchase pattern to fit hips. It's easy to alter the waist at darts and side seams. Adjust the crotch depth **BEFORE** cutting fabric. Crotch depth is the straight line measurement from side waist to chair while sitting. Add 3/4 inch ease. Adjust pattern to measure this distance from back waist to crotch in a straight line.

PATIO PYJAMAS are happening this summer. Prints scream in wild, psychedelic colours and shapes. Hip fit flares to floating legs that skim the ankle like a skirt. Sew a soft cowl-draped top to match or make it all-in-one with bare

halter-neck. Wear with gigantic hoop earrings.

START WITH A COAT-COSTUME to launch your wardrobe off to a happier, better-organized start. Sew coat and matching dress in your favourite colour. Accessorize carefully with hat, shoes, bag, gloves and jewellery. Now, what other clothes do you need for your way of life? Jot down colour and fabric suggestions that coordinate with your coat and accessories. Follow this plan and you'll be able to pack clothes for a week in an overnight bag.
