

SURVEY ON MILL ROAD HAZARDS

Kimberly-Clark Pulp & Paper Company have instituted a survey to establish facts about hazards at the corner of the Mill Road and Highway 17. Everyone is requested to report to the Mill Safety Co-ordinator all accidents or potential accidents occurring in that area. This information will be logged as an accurate record of ;what is happening there. It may be possible with this record, to have steps taken to correct a hazardous situation.

A sample of the kind of information needed is shown below - Actual Example - Date and Time - June 22, 7.50 a.m. Parties Involved - Mill employee and out-of-town car. Particulars - Mill employee had left hand turn signal on indicating turn into Mill Road. Out-of-town car passed disregarding signal at an estimated speed of 65 m.p.h. Employee was watching out-of-town car in rear view mirror and did not make his turn thus avoiding an accident.
