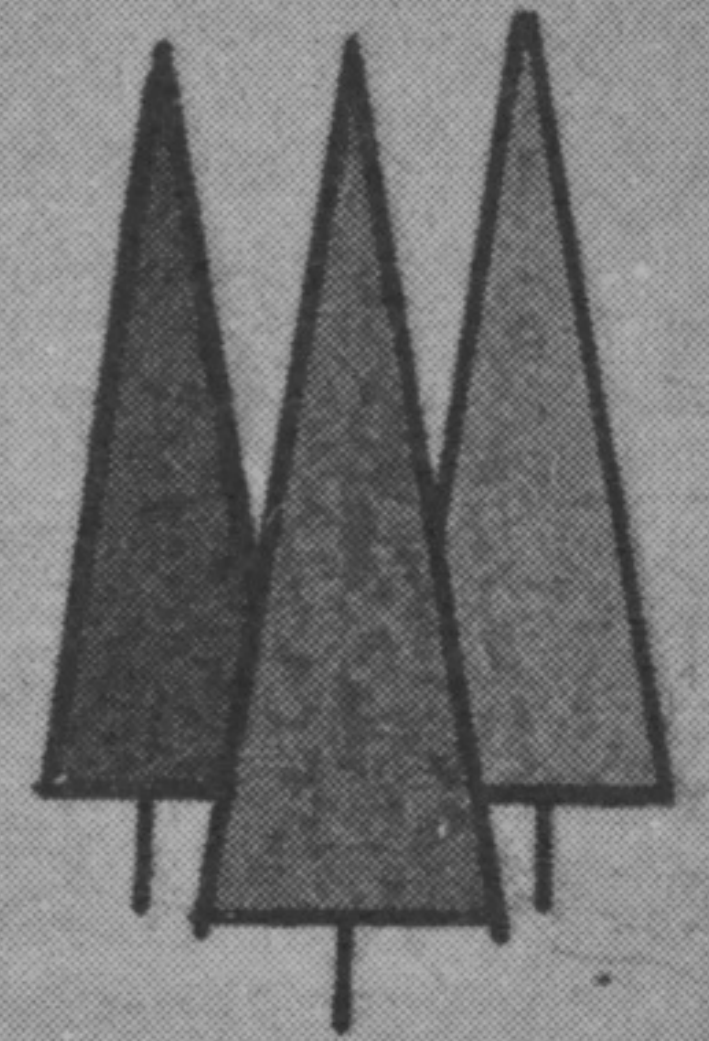

All homes and all businesses are being re-assessed in order to bring them in line with current values. Some assessments may go up and some will go down. Everyone can expect a visit from the assessors.

In the Fall after the assessment roll is returned the assessors will meet all interested parties at an "open house" to explain the evaluation. Ratepayers are urged to attend and acquaint themselves with the facts - ask questions and make comparisons on assessments on comparable homes and businesses.

Please note that this re-assessment includes all homes, businesses, mill property, motels, etc.
