actually used as a private dwelling appertment thereto that are in fact normally and reasonably used as part of a living accommodation. Anyone who contravenes any provision of this section of the Liquor Control Act of Ontario is liable to a fine of not more than \$2,000. or to imprisonment for a term of not more than six months or both. This means you are not allowed to have or consume liquor on a public beach, private car along the highway, small boat while fishing or with you in the bush while hunting.
