LAKESHORE TELEVISION ANNOUNCEMENT

During the past few weeks, TV viewers all over the world have been experiencing freak TV reception. Reports received in England a few years ago are being repeated which bear out the statement that French TV channels are being picked up in the United Kingdom.

Closer to home, Terrace Bay viewers, in the past few weeks have been receiving several Channel 2 signals from distant points at the same time which

interfere severely with local reception.

Due to solar disturbances affecting the ionized layer around the earth, TV signals that usually fall back to earth after they have run their course, bounce, skip and travel to areas sometimes hundreds of miles past their normal range. With about 250 channel 2 stations in North America operating at the same frequency as CKPR-TV, we are at times receiving several of these at the same time, and on the same channel. The main effect of this type of interference is to cause black and white waves to ripple across the screen in a vertical direction and when this interference becomes very severe, the interfering signal can be seen as a negative looking picture floating across the screen in a horizontal direction. These interfering signals can also result in a picture being received from one station and the sound from another at the same time.

This condition is known to be particularly prevalent in the Great Lakes and Gulf of Mexico areas because of a fast change in temperatures around these two bodies of water and because of the peculiar reflecting qualities of large bodies of water.

The condition described usually takes place at two particular periods of the year, the first being centered around the 15th of June, and the other around September, 15 with a possible few short periods at other times of the year. And usually abate as the weather conditions settle down.
