

The Schreiber O.P.P. Detachment have had a busy session, in addition to their regular duties carrying out investigations regarding an alleged plane crash near the mouth of the Steel River, a shooting at Cavers, and the death of an unidentified man found on the C.P.R. tracks at Cavers.

In traffic they had two property damage accidents, resulting in \$1625. damage with injuries sustained in one. Two charges were laid under the O.H.T.A. fourteen motorists warned regarding infractions and vehicles defects, and twenty-eight vehicles given safety checks. Two break and enter charges and four other cases were investigated. This report is for July 9 to 15 with 3251 miles of roads patrolled and 201 duty hours served.

July 16-22 report - Total Duty Hours 248, roads patrolled 3687 miles. Traffic - three charges laid under O.H.T.A. Twelve warnings were issued to motorists regarding infractions and vehicle defects. (cont'd on Pg. 11)
