

TOWNSHIP OF TERRACE BAY - PROCLAMATION 1967 CIVIC HOLIDAY


The Council of The Corporation of The Township of Terrace Bay at its regular meeting held on the 25th day of July, 1967, adopted the following resolution:

"That Monday, August 7th, 1967, be and the same is hereby fixed as the CIVIC HOLIDAY for the current year, and that the REEVE be requested to publish the usual proclamation for this purpose."
