RENOVATION OF SCHREIBER LANDMARK

An extensive renovation is being done on the old 'Corner Store' in Schreiber at a cost of \$21,000. The back of the store, at one time a poolroom and later a warehouse for Spadoni Brothers, present owners has been torn down and the new addition will be a furniture showroom and office rental space. It will have the first 2 x 4 blocks with 2 inch styro-foam insulation in town, one storey and electrically heated.

The former addition was built in 1886, the main store in 1885 by J.E. Walker. Despite the change of ownership, throughout the years the store continues to be known as the corner store.

Originally the store combined groceries and dry goods and at one time the post office. For many years the jeweller had also been the C.P.R. watch inspector.

Grandparents of today - kids of former years - remember the apple barrel which stood in front of the store, guarded by Jim Mudge, against the odd apple borrowed on the way to school. They remember sitting on the floor, while the mail was being sorted, where many went tumbling down the basement steps
