#### PROVINCIAL POLICE REPORT

The Schreiber OPP detachment are having an unusually busy summer, due in part to the many enroute to Expo--from July 30 to August 5 giving out 30 meal tickets to transients from the community fund. They worked 240 hours and patrolled 2,666 miles. One female juvenile missing from Whitby was located in this area and returned home. Two theft investigations are still being carried out. Three charges against minors under the Liquor Control Act were laid. Other inquiries to locate, compassionate messages and assistance to other police departments were carried out. Two injury accidents when three people were injured and four property damage accidents were investigated. Seven charges were laid under the OHTA for violations and 29 checks for vehicle safety and 10 warnings were issued for minor defects or violations.

Magistrate T.A. Connor conducted court in Schreiber on August 1st when 9 traffic cases had fines levied--7 cases were adjourned - 2 warrants were issued - 1 charge dismissed and 1 charge withdrawn. Constable C.R. Duffy is acting in place of Corp. M. Kulmatycki.

From Aug. 6 to 12 the O.P.P. worked 260 3/4 hours and patrolled 2887 miles. One break & entry and one disturbance were investigated. Four charged laid under the OHTA--18 warnings issued re infractions of the OHTA and vehicle defects--29 vehicles given safety checkes. There were 2 injury accidents with six persons injured--three property accidents resulting in approx. \$5020 damage. Eleven transients assisted with meal tickets. G.E. Wills - (Acting).
