BUSINESS COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY

This three-year programme is designed to equip the student with a knowledge of the functional areas of business as well as to provide him with the necessary training to assume responsible positions in computer departments. Demand for business computer specialists will continue to increase in the future and graduates of such a programme will be highly sought after by government, business and other institutions.

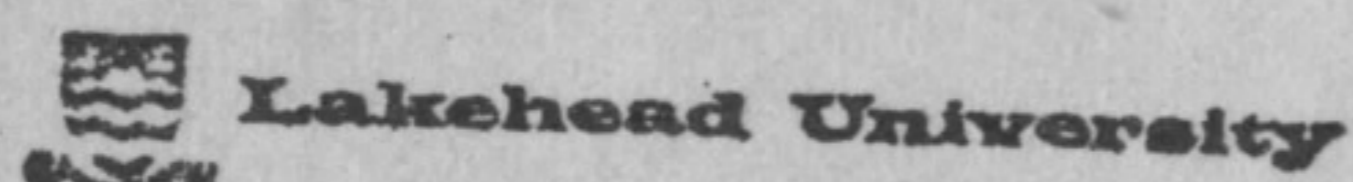
ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- (1) Applicants must have completed successfully the requirements for the Ontario Secondary School Graduation Diploma granted upon the completion of the fourth year of any one of the five-year programmes. They must have passed English and Mathematics in Grades 11 and 12 and any two of History, Geography or Economics in Grade 12 and one other appropriate subject, with an overall average of at least 60%.
- (2) Obtain a satisfactory score on an aptitude test designed to measure a student's ability in the Business Computer field.

If an applicant does not possess the necessary academic prerequisites he may be admitted if his score on the aptitude test is extremely high.

Financial assistance is available for any student who does not have sufficient resources himself.
