When all's said and done, safety is a very personal matter with each one of us. The safety habits we develop, very measurably decide our fate.

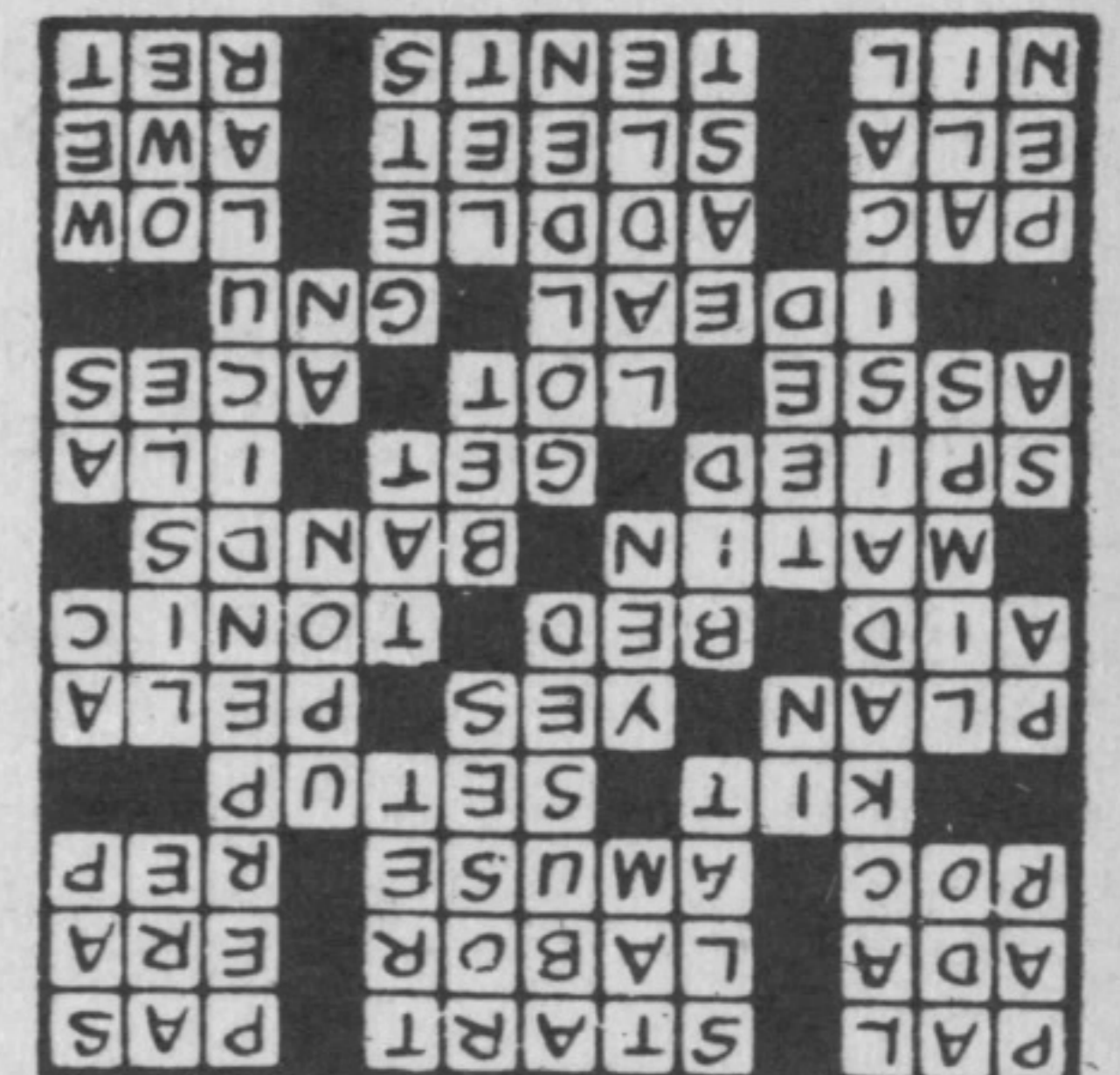
