NO ANGEL BARS FOR MOTORCYCLES

Unusually high handle bars on motorcycles - variously known as "angel bars" or "ape hangers" are banned in Ontario by new regulations effective October 1 that were announced today by Transport Minister Irwin Hasket.

Regulations also prohibit "side-saddle" riding by motorcycle passengers and set out specifications for passenger seats.
