WEEKLY REPORT FROM THE SCHREIBER DETACHMENT OF THE ONTARIO PROVINCIAL POLICE

Total duty hours - 264. Highway & other roads patrolled in miles - 3,114. Investigations - 1 minor disturbance, 1 case of wilful damage was reported by Hydro officials. This occurred as a result of deliberately discharging a firearm at Electrical apparatus. Fortunately no serious damage was inflicted. Once again the public is reminded of the seriousness of cases such as this. 1 investigation was carried out regarding an eloped mental patient. The subject was returned to hospital at Port Arthur. Traffic - 3 accidents investigated, resulting in damage of approximately \$3200. with injuries sustained in one of the mishaps. 3 charges were laid under the Highway Traffic Act. 16 warnings issued and 30 vehicles given safety checks. 6 transients were assisted with meal tickets from the Schreiber Transient and Welfare Fund.
