Reeve W.E. Cavanaugh presided at last Tuesday's council meeting when councillors R. Sinotte, J. Caccamo, D. Desrosiers and R. Bray were all present.

Unfinished business included final arrangements to erect a new flag-pole and to contact the Department of Lands and Forests re fire at Jackfish Lake.

Correspondence included a request from the C. G.I.T. for permission to sell candies and a notice from the Canadian Legion re Armistice wreath. A query re bowling rates was referred back to the Recreation Committee.

Permission was given to the C.G.I.T. and it was moved that a wreath be purchased through the Legion.

A letter was read re balance of capital costs now due on the Home for the Aged. An interim Report was presented by the Hydro Department, and monthly reports were presented by the Building Inspector and the Police Department.

Accounts passed for payments included 62,478.00 Township, 10,035.09 Hydro Department and 512.89 Library.

It was moved by J. Caccamo, seconded by D. Desrosier, that in future, if the press does not

attend meetings, that the minutes be made available for inspection rather than verbal comments of the meeting be given out by employees.

The Clerk was instructed to write the Department of Social and Family Services regarding procedure of appointment to the Board of Management of the District Home for the Aged and to the Ontario Police Commission requesting a meeting with a representative of the Commission to discuss local policing.

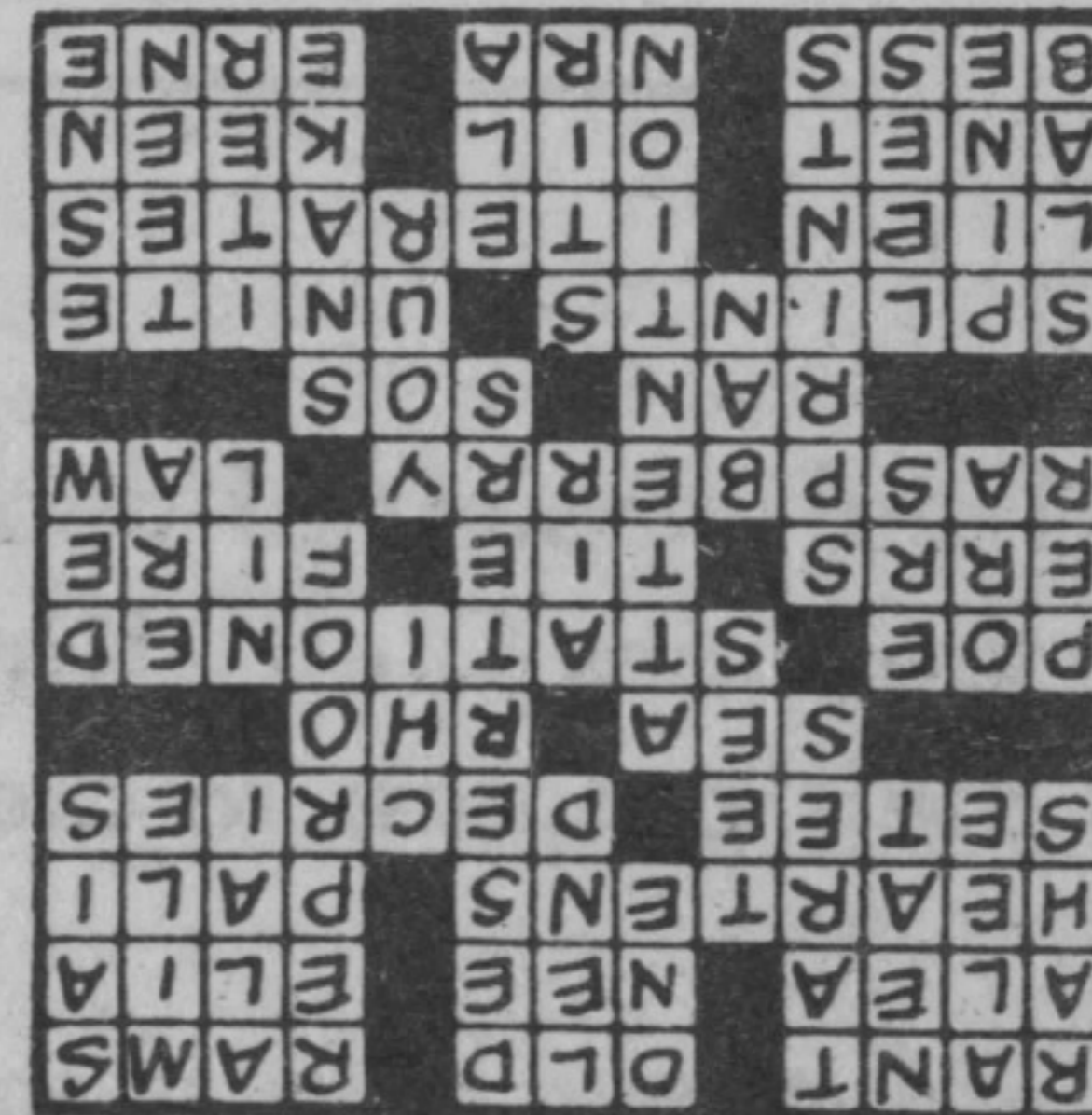
