**CHANGE OF TRAIN SCHEDULE - OFFICE HOURS**

Canadian Pacific Railway announce changes of train schedules and office hours at Terrace Bay station as follows:

Expo Limited Train No. 6 - Eastward will operate until October 31, 9.56 a.m. E.S.T. and after this date will be discontinued. Expo Limited Train No. 5 - Westward will operate until October 29, 8.45 p.m. E.S.T. and after this date will be discontinued. Canadian - No. 2 - Eastward will arrive 12.37 a.m. E.S.T. commencing October 29. Canadian - No. 1 - Westward arrives 11.17 a.m. E.S.T. commencing October 29. Canadian will operate daily and stop for reservation passengers only.

Office Hours - 8 a.m. E.S.T to 5 p.m. E.S.T. daily except Saturday and Sunday for handling of Freight Express and Telegram Service effective October 30. The Waiting Room will open at midnight daily to accommodate passengers entraining and detraining train No. 2 Canadian Eastward.
