## FIGURE SKATING NEWS

At the conclusion of the first half of the figure skating year, twenty one skaters of the Terrace Bay Figure Skating Club have passed a total of 96 Nation al Skating Tests, earning their colorful crests. These tests are held at regular intervals as the skater beccomes proficient.

Our Professional, Mrs. Jennifer Skinner, triple gold medalist, is working hard with the Seniors preparing them for the C.F.S.A. Tests. This year we have skaters working on figure tests from Preliminary to Sixth Figure test, Dance Tests from Preliminary to Senior Silver and Gold, and Bronze and Silver Freeskating Tests. These tests will be held at the end of the skating season. Plans are being formulated for our Carnival to be held in March or early April. The second half of our season starts on January 23rd, and any one wishing to join the club at this time may do so at the Arena, or by phoning Mrs. L. Dejonghe The fee for the balance of the season is \$7.50, and this includes Group Lessons.
