

TEACH YOUR CHILD HOW TO SEW

At an early age, youngsters see sewing as a means of putting things together. They usually are motivated by a desire for the end product - often one of their own creation.

Most educators strongly believe that sewing should be treated as a creative activity. They caution against imposing too much emphasis on sewing methods too early while they strongly recommend teaching how to use tools properly to develop manipulative skills. Although each child is unique, when teaching a child, there are some generalities that may be helpful. Youngsters enjoy working with their hands. They enjoy the prestige of being allowed to use adult equipment - of entering into adult activity. Because their attention span is short, children need guidance in order to achieve some small goals within each activity period. Because they excel in following definite directions, children are a challenge to teach. They will want to know the why of each step you show them. (Cont'd on page 13 column 2)
