ONTARIO PROVINCIAL POLICE REPORT

Total duty hours: 240  
 Highway and Secondary roads patrolled: 4,743 miles  
 Investigations: 1 alleged assault investigated  
 Traffic: 6 charges were laid under the Highway Traffic Act.

85 vehicles were given Safety Checks  
 35 warnings were issued to motorists regarding infractions of the Highway Traffic Act and vehicle defects.  
 2 Transients were assisted in the form of Meal Tickets from the Schreiber Transient and Welfare Fund.

NOTE - Section 97 Ontario Highway Traffic Act:  
 "Where sidewalks are not provided on a highway, a pedestrian walking along the highway shall walk on the left side thereof facing oncoming traffic and, when walking along the roadway shall walk as close to the left edge thereof as possible."

Every person who contravenes this section is liable to a fine of not less than \$5.00 and not more than \$200.00. It is anticipated that the Public will cooperate as they have in the past, otherwise enforcement action will be taken. This means you walk single file, not 6 or more abreast.

Teach your child how to sew (Cont'd from page 11)  
 The reasons help them to remember. With sewing, showing is an important way to teach - but when you show, always have your child watch from behind you. Then she is seeing you work in the same way she will see herself work.

Question: What sewing tools should my daughter have?

Answer: Most mothers prefer their daughters to have their own equipment and their own sewing box or basket for their things. As you can imagine, this will save time and eliminate confusion for both of you. For spark, you might include some colorful spools of size 50 mercerized thread as well as black and white.

The small tools of sewing are things such as needles, pins, pin cushion, thimble, ruler, tape measure and scissors.

Needles - A package of Crewel or Embroidery needles in assorted sizes - each has a long golden eye and is very much easier to thread than a round-eye needle. To thread a needle and tie a knot -

Pins - A small

Bring hands together and gently ease the thread through the eye of the needle.

Pass the grasp of the needle to the right and draw the thread end with the left hand.



To tie a knot, wrap the thread once around the first finger.
