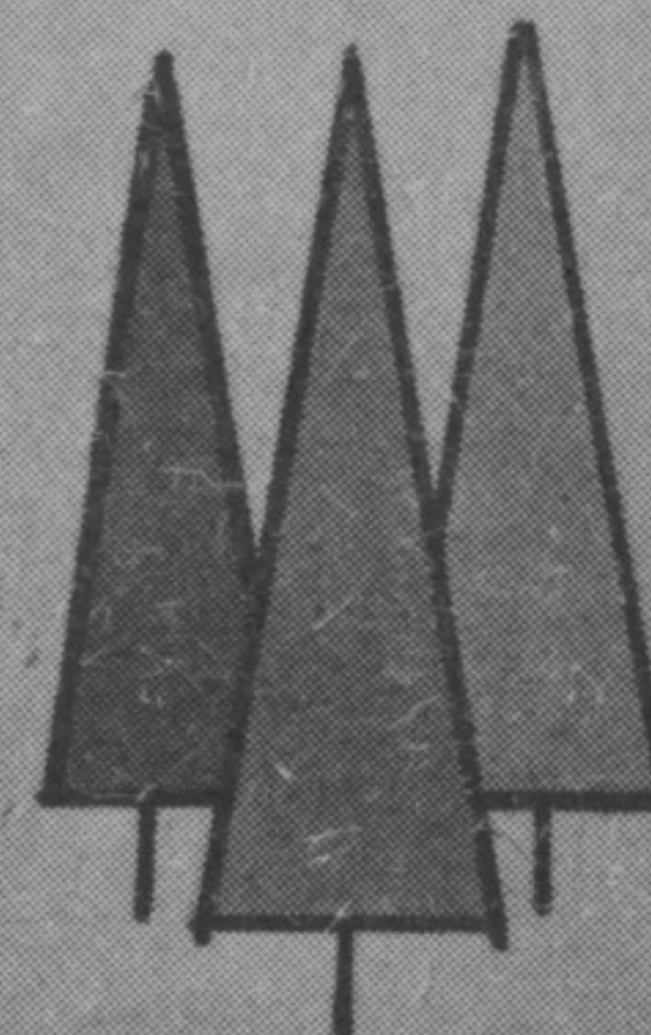

COUNCIL QUOTES

Terrace Bay Town Council met at their regular time, with all members present. Minutes read by Clerk Bill Hanley were adopted.

Correspondence included a letter from Mrs. Jack Brooks, library chairman, stating one resignation had been received, and asked for a new appointment to fill the vacancy.

It was decided to accept in principle, the organization of the District Health Unit.

The Boy Scouts requested permission to hold a Candy Blitz on April 6th. Permission was granted.

Ontario Hydro stated that they would supply Book Covers for the schools.

The Police report included three minor accidents had been investigated. There were no transient meals supplied in the last month. A number of dogs had been destroyed at the owner's request.

Fire Chief Vic Thorpe reported that a Fire Drill had taken place. Stan Hodgkiss had lectured on entry and approach. The Navy Cadet Corps were given lectures on fire drill and procedure, and had visited the Fire Hall.

Accounts passed for payment were as follows: Township - \$55,755.48; Hydro - \$8,993.61; Public Library - \$326.29; Recreation Committee - \$841.35;

Mr. R. Sinotte attended a meeting of the Children's Aid Society in the Lakehead.
