REPLY TO OPEN LETTER TO REEVE & COUNCIL

It seems inconceivable to me that in a small commu-
 nity such as ours, that reasonable men should re-
 sort to a news media to resolve their petty differenc-
 es.

In view of the fact that Constable Dozois accept-
 ed the full responsibility for having the Police car
 serviced in Schreiber and had the decency to ex-
 plain his error to you, leaves me with the only de-
 duction that your open letter to the Reeve and Coun-
 cil is a deliberate attempt to embarrass that body,
 and makes it necessary for me to answer you in kind.

In your letter, you specifically mention the pur-
 chase of tires. May I refresh your memory to the

 Enterprises for the sum of \$101.55, unless you are
 referring to snow tires purchased by previous Coun-
