The by-law reads: Daylight Saving Time be observed in the Township of Terrace Bay during the period beginning at 2 a.m. on the last Sunday in April, and ending at 2 a.m. on the last Sunday in October. This by-law is a result of an Opinion Poll taken in town, and showed a majority desires to observe D.S.T. for the same period as is used nationally.

Reeve Cavanaugh suggested a letter be sent to the C.P.R. and the local M.P. requesting proper lighting around the station.

Meeting was adjourned.


