TOWN HOSTS DISTRICT O.M.R.A. CONFERENCE

A Thunder Bay District Ontario Municipal Recreation Association Conference was held in Terrace Bay on Friday and Saturday, April 19th and 20th. This is the first time that Municipal Recreation Committees in the Thunder Bay district have ever come together for a meeting.

The purpose of this conference was to acquaint members of Municipal Recreation Committees in this district with the O.M.R.A. and what it could do for the municipalities and surrounding areas, to determine whether or not there was a need for a Zone structure of the O.M.R.A., and if so, what this structure should be; and to draw up resolutions to be presented by the District Representative to the provincial conference of the O.M.R.A. in Niagara Falls in May of this year.

Representatives were present from the municipalities of Fort William, Port Arthur, Paipoonge,
Shuniah, Red Rock, Marathon, Manitouwadge and
Terrace Bay, as well as Mr. Terry Axelson, the
District Representative of O.M.R.A., and Miss
Margaret Phillips, the district consultant for the
community Programs Section of the Ontario Department of Education.

The Thunder Bay Zone of the O.M.R.A. was formed as a result of this meeting. The Zone is comprised of 4 regions - Region A, Schreiber to Manitouwadge and White River; Region B, Nipigon to Hurkett and Cameron Falls; Region C, the cities of Port Arthur and Fort William and surrounding municipalities; Region D, takes in Highway #11 east of Nipigon to Longlac, as well as Nakina.

Each of these regions is to hold 2 meetings per year, with an annual Zone meeting to be held each spring preceeding the annual provincial meeting.

Six very meaningful resolutions were drawn up to be presented at the May meeting in Niagara Falls. The resolutions vary from requesting revision to the recently-announced changes in the hunting and fishing license fees, to requesting legislation governing (Cont'd on page 12)
