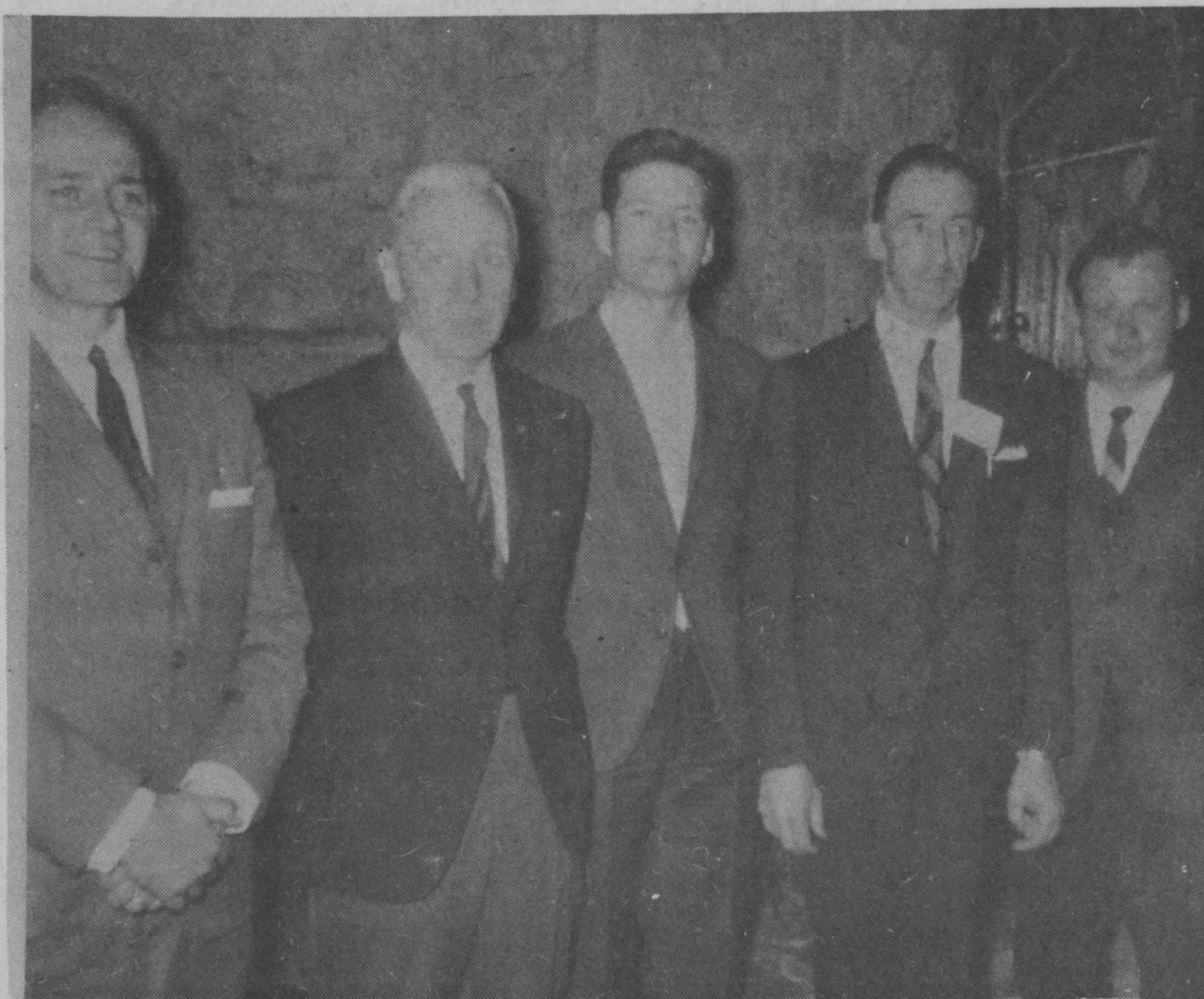

COMPUTERIZED TIMETABLE FOR HIGH SCHOOLS

All Canadian high schools may be under the same computer-controlled timetable system within four years, says Office Equipment & Methods. A giant information system is now being used by four Ottawa high schools to handle timetabling, attendance and statistical reports, report cards and letters to parents. It is hoped to handle up to 6,000 schools in 72 hours when in full operation by 1972.
