PENSIONS AT 66 IN JANUARY NEXT An extra 42,000 persons in Ontario will become eligible for the universal Old Age Security pension in January, 1968, and so should be making application at this time. These are the people who were born in 1902 and who will reach 66 by the end of this calendar year. Canadian citizenship is not required for eligibility. Because of this an increase in the cost of living, the monthly pension is now \$ 76.50. Mr. J.G. Parsons, Regional Director of Old Age Security for Ontario, stated that applications from persons born in the year 1902 have been very slow coming in to the Ontario Regional Office. Less than 6000 or 14 percent were received by the end of March.
