Nearly 1500 active cases were found in Ontario last year. A major concern is the susceptibility of children. Despite all the changes, the need for voluntary workers still exists, and the work must be carried on in a new broader sense. In arousing public concern no one doubts the value of the local committee, despite its size.

### POLITICAL NOTES

Bob Andras will be running in Port Arthur. The federal electoral district of Port Arthur, which was in the 27th Parliament, has been divided into two, under redistribution: Port Arthur and Thunder Bay.

The new riding stretches from White River and Hornepayne in the East, James Bay in the far North and Dryden and Atikokan in the West.

For some time it was rumored that Mr. Andras would be a candidate in the new riding, however, recently Mr. Andras announced that he will seek nomination in Port Arthur.

The Thunder Bay Liberal Association will be holding a Nomination Convention in Atikokan, Ont., where the candidate will be chosen.

So far only Mr. George Wither of Winnipeg, former resident of the Lakehead, has announced that he will seek nomination. It is rumored that Mr. Joe Douglas of Beardmore, longtime resident of this district, will let his name stand before delegates.

It is also speculated that Mr. Ray Rudiak of Geraldton, unsuccessful Liberal candidate in the recent provincial election, is interested in contesting the nomination.
