VOWS EXCHANGED IN COMMUNITY CHURCH

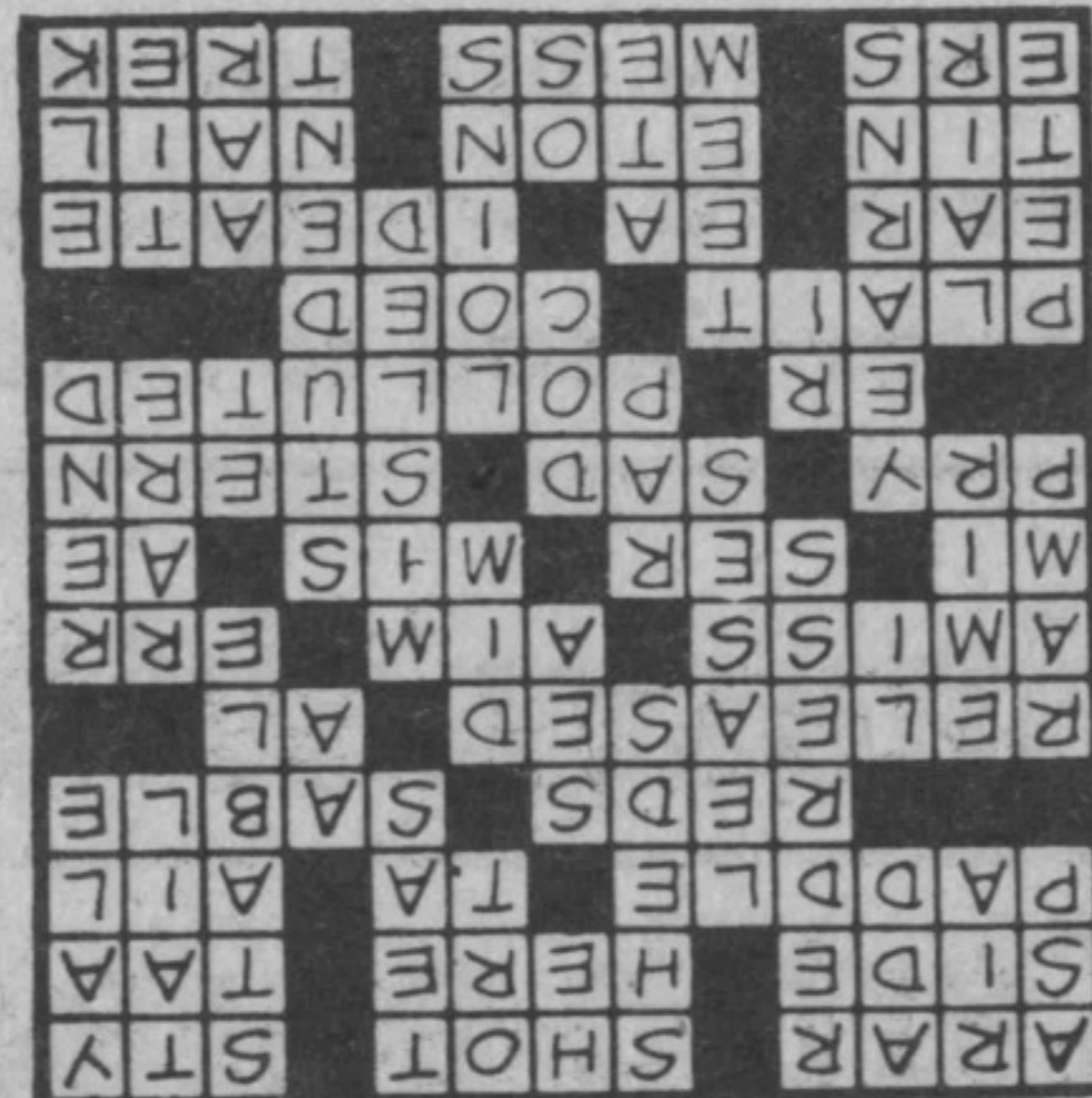

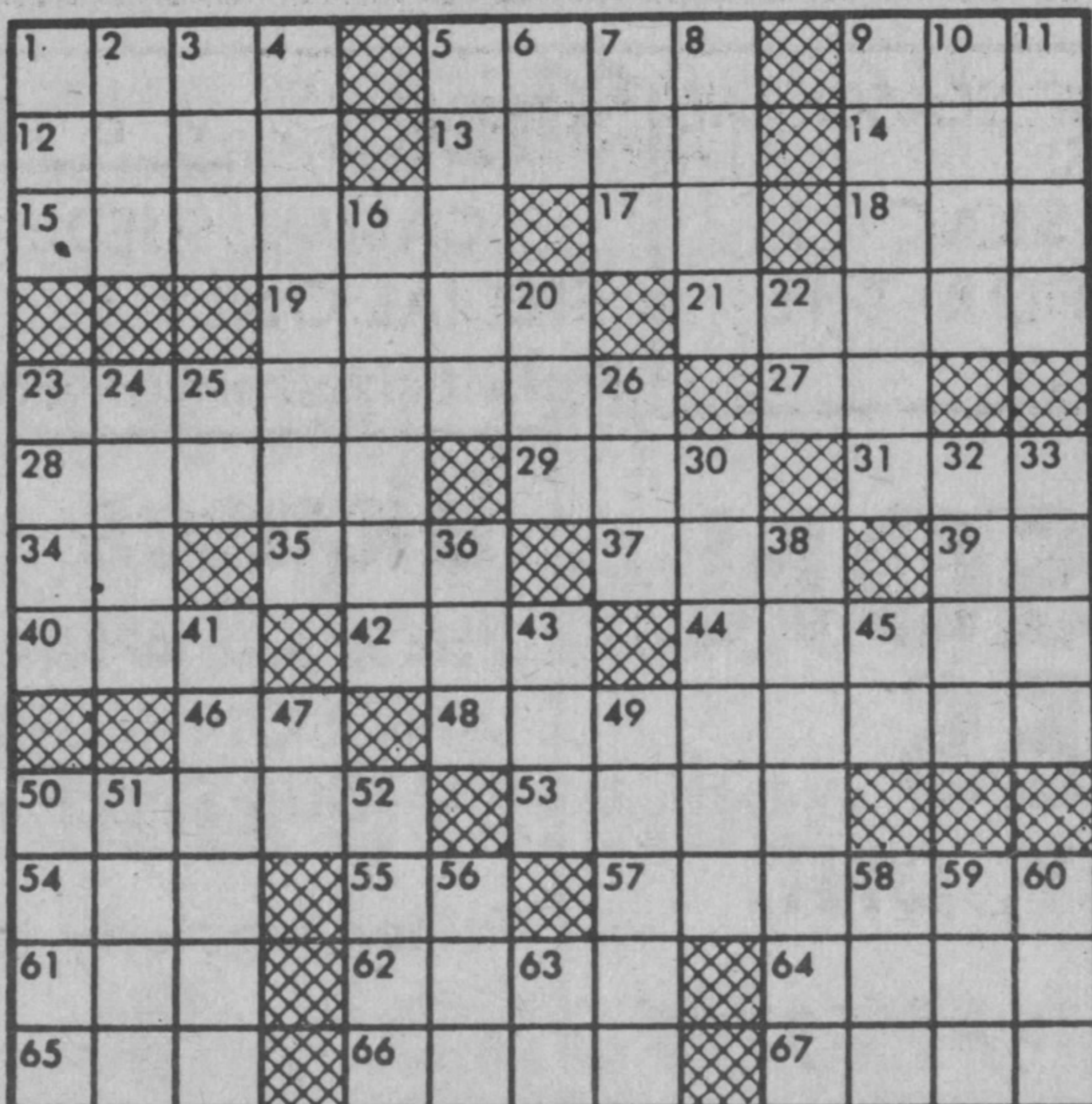
