A discussion on Fire Works display for July 1st took place, when it was decided to try a Daylight Display, which would enable the committee to hold it earlier in the evening, possibly around 8 p.m.

A resolution for salary schedules for all municipal personnel was approved.

By-law 211, establishing a Reserve Fund for purchasing a new Fire Truck, was approved. It is the intention of Council to recommend it to the Council of 1969-70.

It was moved and seconded that the following policy be established regarding subsidy towards installation of a new service where electric heating is installed.

1 - That the subsidy would apply only to residential customers. 2 - That the installation must be a permanent type.

3 - That subsidy be apid at the following rates: a) for complete conversion to all electric homes with 100 or 150 Amp. service - \$150; b) for complete conversion to all electric homes with 200 Amp. service - \$200; c) for new all electric homes with 200 Amp. service - \$200 d) for supplementary electric heating -

100 Amp. service - minimum of 4 K.W. \$100; e) for supplementary electric heating - 150 Amps service - minimum 5 K.W. \$150; f) for supplementary electric heating - 200 Amps., mimimum 6 K.W. - \$200.

4 - Payment of subsidy to the customers will be made - subject to complete inspection and final approval being issued by the Township Electrical Superintendant. 5 - Those who have failed to comply with the provisions of By-law 39, by taking out a building permit, will not quality for the subsidy.
