Pat Auger returned Saturday, from a holiday in Toronto and Minniapolis, Minn.

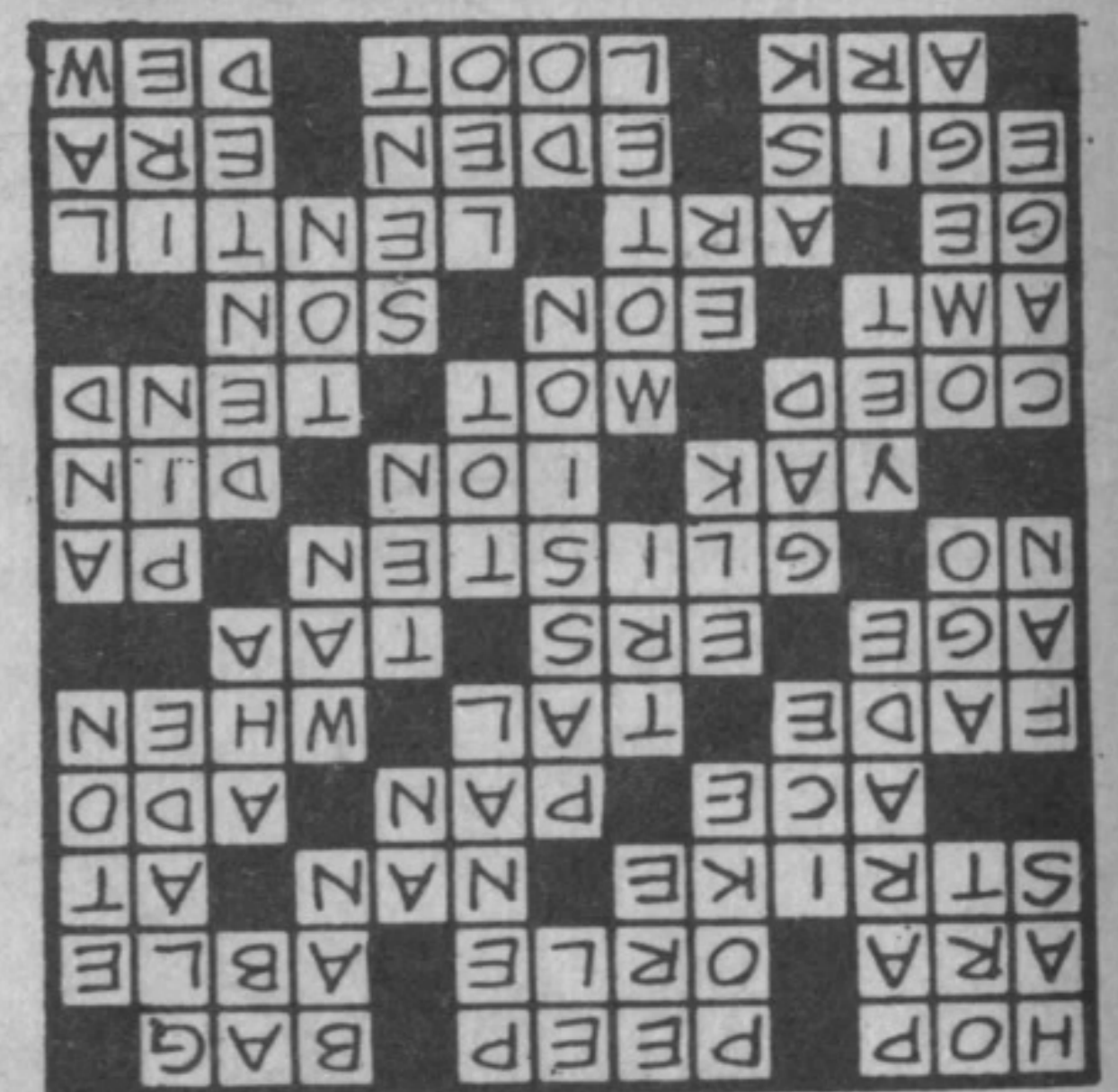
Peter Legault has arrived home from Port Arthur for the summer vacation.
